Appendix 4C Quarterly Report for March 2025 - Revised

Reference: Clarification to Appendix 4C March Quarter 2025 (released 23 April 2025)

Papyrus Australia Ltd (PPY) is providing clarifications and a revision to the March 2025 Quarterly Appendix 4C released to the market on 23 April, and particularly the treatment of R&D expenditure incurred by PPYeg on behalf of PPY.

- a. Nature of the treatment
R&D expenditure of \$527k incurred and reported in the March 2025 quarterly appendix 4C at item 1.9. Payment for this expenditure was offset against the PPYeg loan account and hence was treated as a cash payment and accordingly reflected in the Appendix 4C.
- b. Reason for the amendment
This R&D expenditure was treated as a cash payment and was offset against the PPYeg loan account. This logic was based on the fact that if the invoice raised by PPYeg had been physically paid in cash and PPY had at the same time received a repayment from PPYeg of a similar amount in cash, then the treatment reflected in the lodged appendix 4C would have been correct.

Following discussions with the Company auditor it became clear that this treatment (i.e. offsetting the R&D expenditure against the PPYeg loan account) was not correct and should have been treated as a non-cash transaction and therefore not included in the March 2025 Appendix 4C. The amended Appendix 4C attached to this letter reflects the correct position after removing PPYeg expenditure from item no 1.9 and the PPYeg loan account reflected in item 2.6.

Drawdowns at the board's discretion can be request in tranches of \$50k. Interest is only payable on any drawdown amounts and is calculated by applying the NAB "Usaver savings account or, the 12 months term deposit rates" (whichever is the greater plus a 1% margin). Currently no drawdowns have been made on this facility.</p> <p>The Company has an arrangement with Radium Capital to advance loans based on the R&D undertaken that is eligible under the Australian Government Research and Development Tax Incentive Program (R&DTI). The process for drawdowns requires the company to make an application to Radium Capital which is supported by expenditure incurred. The repayment of the loan drawdowns is repaid following the submission of the Company tax return at year end. The annual interest rate payable on loan drawdowns is 16%.</p> <p>The company has applied to Radium Capital to extend the current R&DTI loan facility based on the additional R&D work completed and expensed YTD.</p>
