Acusensus signs Service Delivery Statement of Work for New Zealand mobile speed program

Highlights

- Acusensus has signed the statement of work for full service delivery of the nationwide mobile speed camera enforcement program in New Zealand (Service Delivery Statement of Work).
- The Service Delivery Statement of Work commences on 1 July 2025 and continues until the start of December 2029, with the potential for two extensions of up to two years each.
- The estimated value of the program that commenced in December 2024 is up to NZ\$92 million (excluding GST) over the initial five-year term, including the mobilisation payment of a NZ\$5.2 million (excluding GST) made when the original Master Services Agreement and Service Establishment Statement of Work were signed in December 2024.

Acusensus Limited (ASX:ACE) (**Acusensus**), a technology company designing and developing artificial intelligence enabled road safety solutions, is pleased to announce that further to its announcement on 4 December 2024, Acusensus NZ Limited, a subsidiary of Acusensus, has signed the Service Delivery Statement of Work with the New Zealand Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (**NZTA**). The Service Delivery Statement of Work will be delivered under terms of the Master Services Agreement previously signed between Acusensus NZ Limited and NZTA in December 2024 after Acusensus NZ Limited was selected as the successful vendor in a tender for mobile safety camera systems for the detection of speed offences across the New Zealand road network.

Acusensus expects to commence the delivery of mobile speed camera services under this Service Delivery Statement of Work today, 1 July 2025. This succeeds a previous statement of work under which initial operations commenced with testing in May 2025. This program will see a mix of vehicle and trailer-based speed enforcement solutions deployed across the New Zealand road network. Following a ramp-up period, there will be an estimated fleet of 44 enforcement cameras, which are all expected to be operational in FY26. The services provided under the Service Delivery Statement of Work will continue until the start of December 2029 and may be extended for two periods of up to two years each at NZTA's election. The Master Services Agreement has a term of five years from the December 2024 signing date and also has two optional extension periods of up to two years each.

The price payable for the speed enforcement program is estimated to be up to NZ\$92 million (excluding GST) over the initial five-year term, including the NZ\$5.2 million (excluding

GST) mobilisation payment that was contracted under the Service Establishment Statement of Work that was signed in December 2024.

Acusensus Founder and Managing Director, Alexander Jannink, said:

"We are delighted to have finalised the Service Delivery Statement of Work and look forward to commencing the full deployment of our mobile speed enforcement program in New Zealand. This initiative will enhance road safety by deterring dangerous speeding and ultimately save lives. I am immensely proud of the work the Acusensus team has done to mobilise this new program` on schedule."
