Quarterly Activity and Cash Flow Report

ImpediMed Limited (ASX:IPD) (ImpediMed or the Company) announces the release of the Quarterly Activities Report and Appendix 4C Cash Flow Report for the quarter ending 30 September 2025 (Q1 FY26).

Business update

ImpediMed is well positioned to capitalise on opportunities across multiple indications, leveraging its investment in a world-class digital health platform, FDA clearances in Breast Cancer Related Lymphoedema (BCRL), Heart Failure and Body Composition, alongside growing patient needs in cancer survivorship, GLP-1 driven weight management and heart failure.

Over 600 SOZO units are installed at leading US hospitals, including Mayo Clinic and Cleveland Clinic and Master Services Agreements (MSAs) have been signed with 27 major Integrated Delivery Networks (IDNs), streamlining IT approvals and enabling the Company to rapidly access opportunities for an additional 1,400 units in BCRL.

Meetings recently attended in the US by the Company's CEO, Dr Parmjot Bains and SVP Sales, Scott Long, confirm strong clinical demand for the early detection of breast-cancer-related lymphoedema, supported by NCCN and NAPBC guidelines and improved reimbursement in key states. Four new system agreements in the quarter provide access to over 700 hospitals, coinciding with enhanced coverage and a strengthened sales team.

The launch of SOZO Pro, the only FDA-cleared BIS device for patients with cardiac implantable devices, strengthens the Company's competitive edge and enables scalable growth with our existing infrastructure. Heart Failure and Body Composition launches have been initiated. In Heart Failure, commercial pilots in the US are underway leveraging the new SOZO Pro platform. Feedback from US cardiologists has been positive. In Body Comp, supported by the increasing GLP-1 related trends, and targeted conference attendance, over 300 Body Comp leads were generated in the quarter.

Key sales and financial metrics

Unaudited total revenue for the quarter was a record A\$3.6million, net of the unfavourable impact of a stronger Australian dollar, resulting in a 9% increase compared with revenue of A\$3.3 million for the quarter ending 30 June 2025.

45 SOZO units were sold in the quarter compared with 44 units in Q4 FY25. 26 SOZO units were sold in the US compared with 44 units in the prior quarter. This was below plan and while sufficient sales orders were generated, delays in final approvals by hospitals resulted in a reduction on the previous quarter's record result.

The Core Business Total Contracted Value (TCV) signed during the quarter was A\$4.7 million, compared with the record A\$6.3 million achieved in Q4 FY25. The decrease was a combination of lower US units sold, along with a reduction of units due for renewal in the quarter. Although the TCV was lower than anticipated, the Company was pleased with the quality of accounts initiated and renewed in the quarter with a significant number being Key Accounts, IDNs, NAPBC and NCCN Centres, coupled with solid price increases on renewal, averaging 10% for the quarter.

The additional TCV signed in the quarter increased the SOZO Core Business Annual Recurring Revenue (ARR) to A\$14.4 million for the 12 months to 30 September 2027. This compares with ARR at the end of Q4 FY25 of \$14.0 million. The ARR was also negatively impacted by a relatively stronger Australian dollar. Churn remains at less than 3%.

Summary of cash receipts and outflows

During Q1 FY26 the Company had net cash outflows from operating activities of A\$5.6 million, which is net of cash receipts from customers of A\$3.4 million. The net cash outflows from operating activities were affected by a previously flagged one-off payment for long lead items (electronic components) of \$1.1 million. All other cash outflow items were relatively consistent with prior quarters.

The majority of the cash outflows for the quarter relate to staff costs which totalled A\$4.9 million, slightly below the previous quarter's result of \$5.0 million.

The Company maintains an ongoing program of cost control as part of the target to reach cash flow break even.

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As at 30 September 2025, ImpediMed has a total cash balance of A\$23.0 million comprising A\$2.5 million cash in bank and A\$20.5 million in term deposits. Strengthening of the Australian dollar resulted in an unrealised FX loss of \$0.7million. The cash balance includes US\$5.0 million from Tranche 2 of the US\$15.0 million debt growth capital facility, which was drawn down in July 2025.

Payments to related parties and their associates during the quarter disclosed in Section 6 of the Appendix 4C totaled A\$90,000 and comprised payments to Non-Executive Directors.

Reimbursement

Reimbursement coverage has re-accelerated since the 30 June 2025 with the number of states above 80% coverage increasing to 42, up from 25 and the number of states with coverage above 90% increasing to 27, up from 7. In addition to the major commercial payor that commenced coverage from July 1, 2025, another top 10 payor published positive coverage, as announced on 2nd October 2025. Since then, a further 4 Blue Cross Blue Shield plans have updated their policies to include BIS as medically necessary. Reimbursement initiatives continue, as the Company looks to support customers, update guidelines and enhance coverage. Whilst the Company's goal of 100% coverage remains, reimbursement levels are sufficient to support the sales needed to achieve Company's stated goals.

Change in Director remuneration

Consistent with the Company's focus on financial discipline, effective 1 July 2025, the Board Chair's fee was reduced by 30% and the fee paid to the other non-executive Directors was reduced by 15%. All Director fees are paid 85% in cash and 15% in equity, awarded following the end of each quarter. The Board will review Non-executive Director's fees when the Company achieves cash flow break even.
