Scout Security Quarterly Update and Appendix 4C

Home security provider Scout Security Ltd (ASX: SCT), "Scout" or "the Company") is pleased to present its Appendix 4C — Quarterly Cash Flow Report for the period ending 30 September 2025 and update on business progress.

Highlights of the September Quarter

- **Advanced strategic Roo Inc merger, with signed agreements expected in early Q2 FY26**
- **Raised A\$600k in new capital from private investors to support working capital requirements**
- **Progressed negotiations with Insurtech partner for new white label offering**
- **Continued preparation for planned lifting of ASX suspension from trade**

Financial and Operational Highlights

The September quarter marked an important period of operational discipline and strategic repositioning for Scout. Management and the Board prioritised bringing the Company's reporting obligations current while simultaneously advancing transformative strategic initiatives that are expected to deliver long-term shareholder value.

During the quarter, Scout successfully released all outstanding quarterly reports for FY25, including the Appendix 4C reports for Q2, Q3, and Q4. The Company also made significant progress on its FY25 Half Year audit, which was subsequently released at the start of Q2 FY26.

Scout continued to advance the proposed merger with Roo Inc, a strategically important transaction for the Company. The merger presents an opportunity to enhance Scout's market position and create value for shareholders through complementary capabilities and market access. Both parties continued their collaborative work throughout the quarter, binding agreements were subsequently executed in Q2 FY26 and completion is now subject to a shareholder meeting in December 2025.

To support working capital requirements and strategic initiatives, Scout raised A\$600k during the quarter from new private investors. This capital injection provides the Company

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with additional resources as it works toward completing the Roo Inc merger and pursuing growth opportunities in its white label business.

Scout also progressed discussions and negotiations with an Insurtech partner for a new white label offering. This partnership opportunity reflects Scout's ongoing strategy to expand its white label platform into adjacent markets where DIY security solutions can deliver value to partners and end consumers.

Statements pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 4.7C.1

Payments to related parties and their associates during the quarter totalled \$152,350k, relating to \$110,870 in Executive Director remuneration and the payment of \$42,350 in commission for equity raising to an entity associated with a non-executive director.

Quarterly expenditure was in line with internal budgets and was focused on these areas:

- In reference to item 1.2(f) of the Appendix 4C, administration and corporate costs totaling \$550k were higher than the previous quarter and within the average quarterly range for these costs. This reflects a reduction of accrued payables.
- In reference to item 1.2(e) of the Appendix 4C, staff costs totaling \$225k were higher than the previous quarter and reflect the average level of costs moving forward for the current staffing level.
- In reference to item 1.2(b) of the Appendix 4C, product manufacturing and operating costs totaling \$70k were lower than the prior quarter and lower than the average quarterly range for these costs. This reflects a reduction in larger product orders placed with manufacturers.

The Company retains sufficient funding to carry out its activities over the coming quarters based on current funding initiatives as described elsewhere in this report and other funding initiatives currently being contemplated by the board.

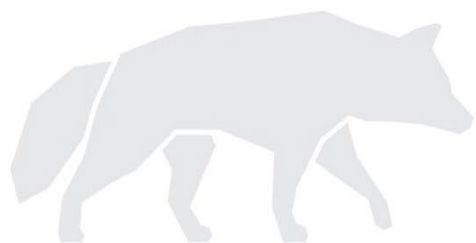

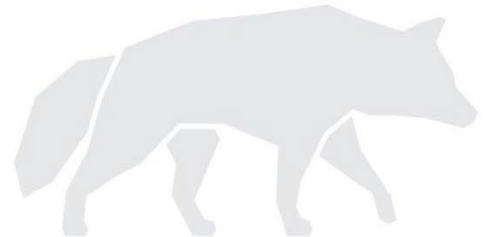
