N1H Quarterly activity report and trading update (for the period of 1 October 2025 to 31 December 2025)

N1 Holdings Limited (ASX: **N1H** or the “**Company**”) is pleased to announce the December 2025 quarter business update and cashflow results. This quarter delivered strong financial outcomes across revenue, net profit, and cash receipts from customers, reflecting disciplined execution, sustained broker engagement, and enhanced funding efficiency. The Company’s origination volumes increased during the quarter, supported by improved product competitiveness driven by lower funding costs and the Company’s established distribution channels across mortgage brokers, referral partners, and aggregators.

In November 2025, ASIC released Report 820: *Private credit surveillance: retail and wholesale funds*, which highlighted key strengths and deficiencies in private credit practices and signalled increased regulatory scrutiny of the sector. The Company welcomes robust regulatory and compliance frameworks that support effective oversight of the market and continues to operate in accordance with applicable regulatory and governance requirements.

The Company remains firmly anchored to its lending principles, offering loans exclusively against established Australian properties, with no exposure to construction lending, and maintaining strict asset-selection criteria.

The following key performance metrics highlight the Company’s continued successful execution of its management strategy.

Highlights of FYTD (1 July 2025 to 31 December 2025) and quarterly cash flow and financial performance:

- Net profit before income tax for the first half year of the financial year ending 30 June 2026 (**HY26**) was approximately \$1,246,000 (unaudited), with EBITDA of \$1,398,000 (unaudited).
- Revenue for HY26 was \$11.14 million (unaudited) representing a 4.8% increase compared to the same period last year.
- Cash receipts from customers amounted to \$8.53 million for the quarter ended 31 December 2025 (**Q2 FY26**), representing a 191% increase compared to the same period last year.
- The Company’s SME lending business (including management fees derived from One Lending Fund through N1 Asset Management) continued to be the major revenue generator of the Company, accounting for 98% of total cash receipts from customers in the quarter. Total cash receipts from customers via the SME Lending business were \$8.33 million for the quarter.
- Net cash inflow from operating activities for Q2 FY26 was \$16.016 million.
- The Company’s cash balance as of 31 December 2025 was \$35.48 million.

Company Business activities

During Q2 FY26, the Company recorded gross revenue of \$6.15 million (unaudited), representing a 15% increase compared to the same period last year.

During the quarter, the Company successfully expanded and diversified funding sources with a strategic focus on reducing the overall cost of funds. This included renegotiating terms with existing funders, optimising funding structures and expanding its network of funding partners to enhance competitiveness and support margin resilience.

Operational costs remained stable during the quarter despite increased origination volumes, supported by efficiency improvements delivered through the Company’s ongoing AI initiatives. These initiatives enhanced processing efficiency and operational scalability.

In parallel, the Company continued to deepen relationships with mortgage brokers, referral partners, and aggregators, further strengthening its distribution network and positioning the business to benefit from future market opportunities as funding and rate conditions evolve.

One Lending Fund's revenue was \$1.233 million (unaudited) for Q2 FY26. Please note that One Lending Fund's revenue does not form part of the Company's revenue (as this is a separate SME lending fund managed by N1 Asset Management, a 100% owned subsidiary of the Company).

As of the date of this report, the total lending capacity that the Company is able to access and manage is approximately \$351 million, which consists of approximately \$24 million of balance sheet capital raised from private debt, \$305 million under various debt facilities and approximately \$22 million from One Lending Fund, mortgage funds under management. Please note that One Lending Fund is not consolidated into the Company's financial statements and is managed by N1 Venture Pty Ltd, a 100% owned subsidiary of N1H.

The Company continues to raise funds for SME lending purposes, including via One Lending Fund.
