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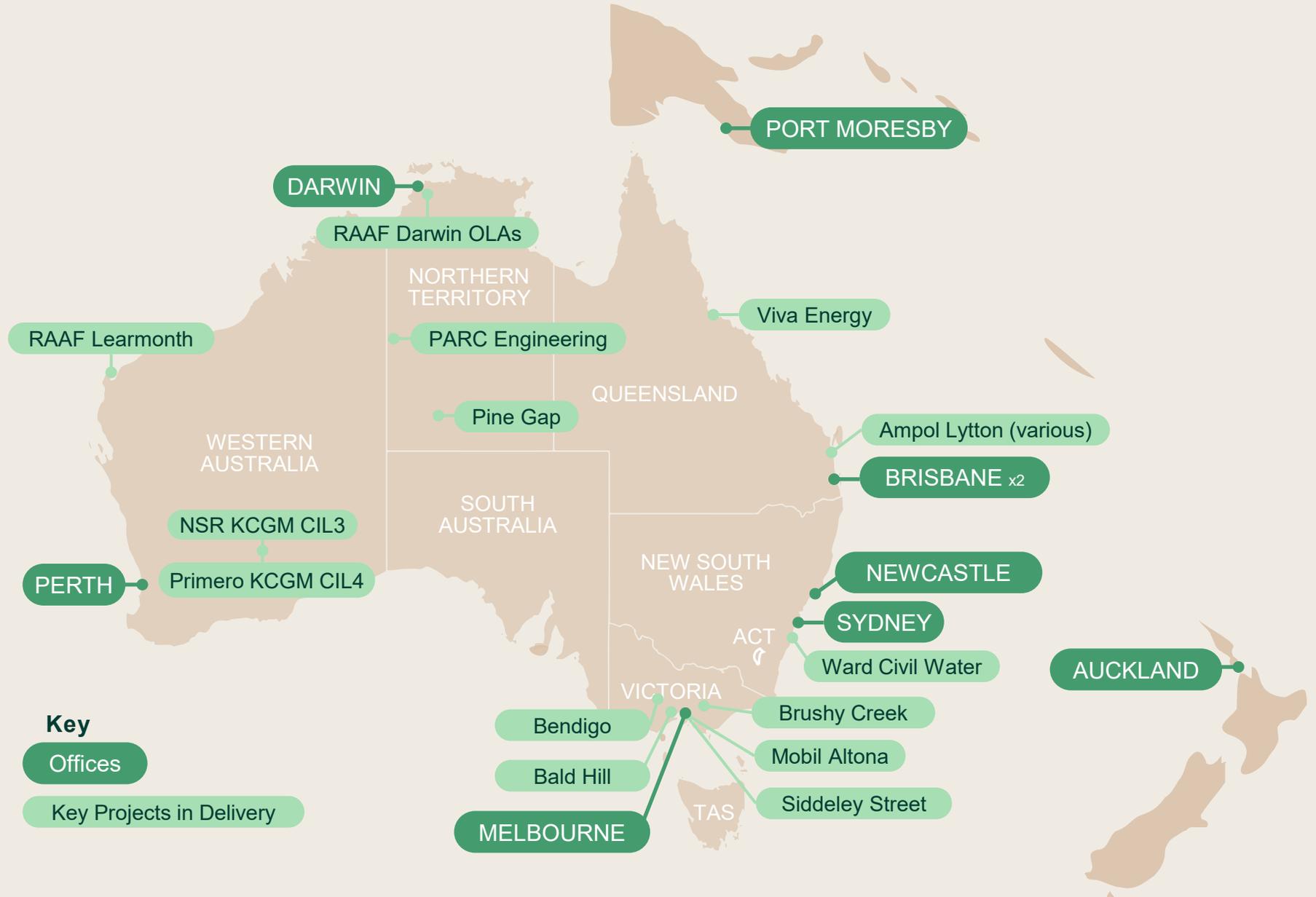

Key Insights

Revenue increased by 13.7% reflecting the inclusion of Aqua Metro from 1 July 2025.

Materials & third-party costs charged to projects increased by 42.7% as a result of higher activity and revenue levels with the inclusion of Aqua Metro.

Acquisition & Integration Costs related to the acquisition and integration of Aqua Metro.

Adjusted EBITDA was \$0.37m, after excluding \$1.3m acquisition & integration costs. The period was impacted by challenges as outlined at the AGM.

Depreciation and amortisation expense increased 70.1% due to amortisation of intangible assets following the acquisition of Aqua Metro.

EPS (adjusted) for the period was a 2.14 cents loss, lower than H1 FY25 due to lower NPAT and an increase in the ordinary shares on issue.

Unless otherwise stated, all comparisons are to the prior corresponding period (H1 FY2025). Percentages are not shown where results have moved from profit to loss, as they are not meaningful.

Key Insights

Cash balance increased by \$4.6m due to improvements in working capital, with \$18.7m Net Cash.

Decrease in **contract assets** and increase in **contract liabilities** reflecting improved contract terms and reduced working capital.

Increase in **other financial liabilities** due to earn-out contingent consideration for Aqua Metro acquisition.

Intangible assets increased from the Aqua Metro acquisition.

Borrowings reflect the draw down of the CBA acquisition loan.

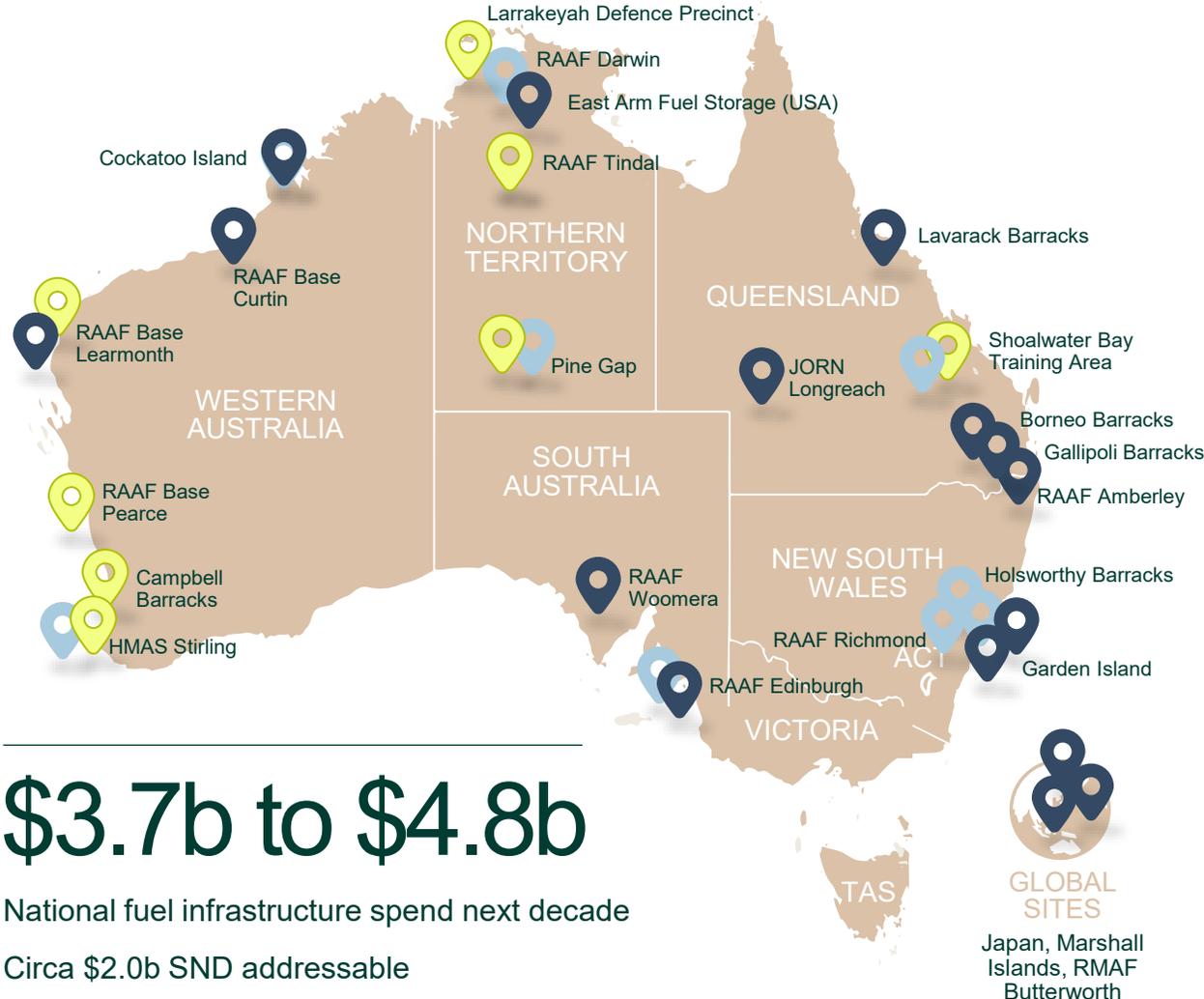

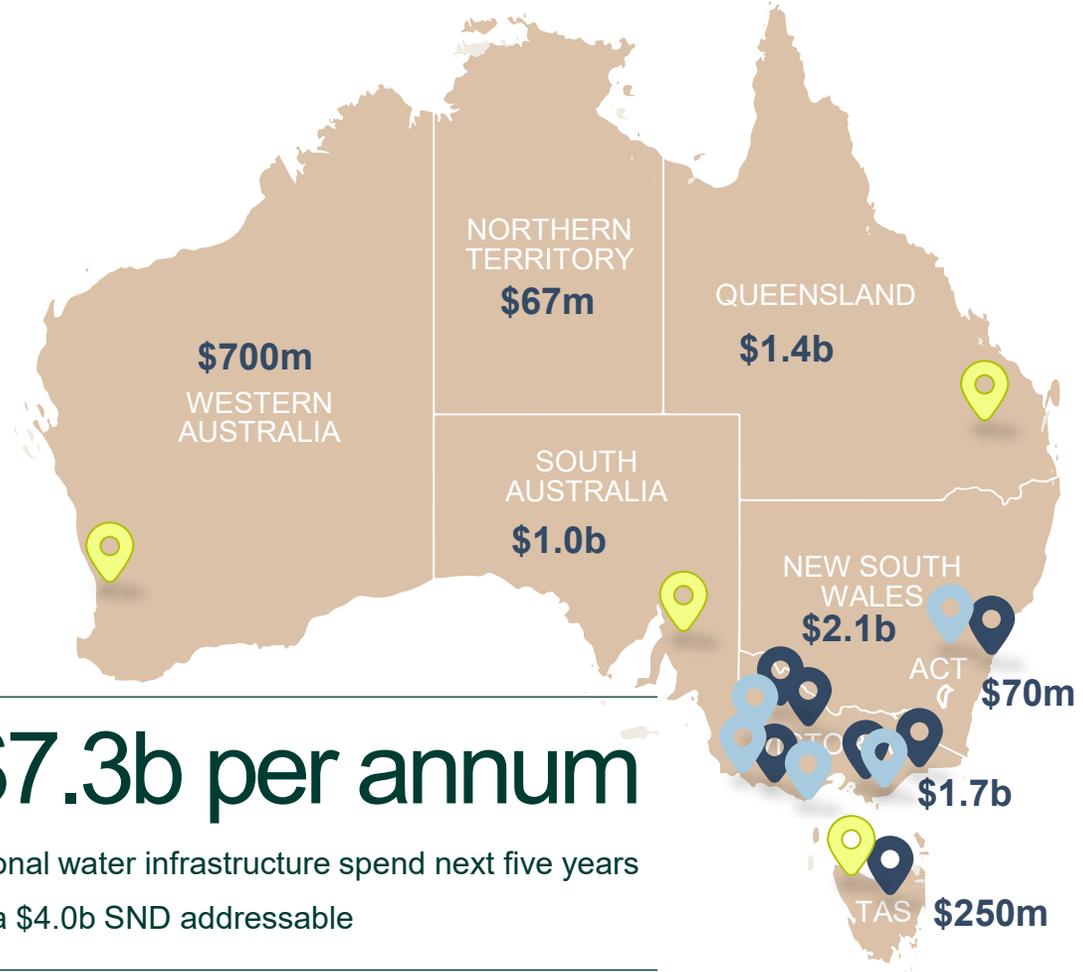
Strategic Position

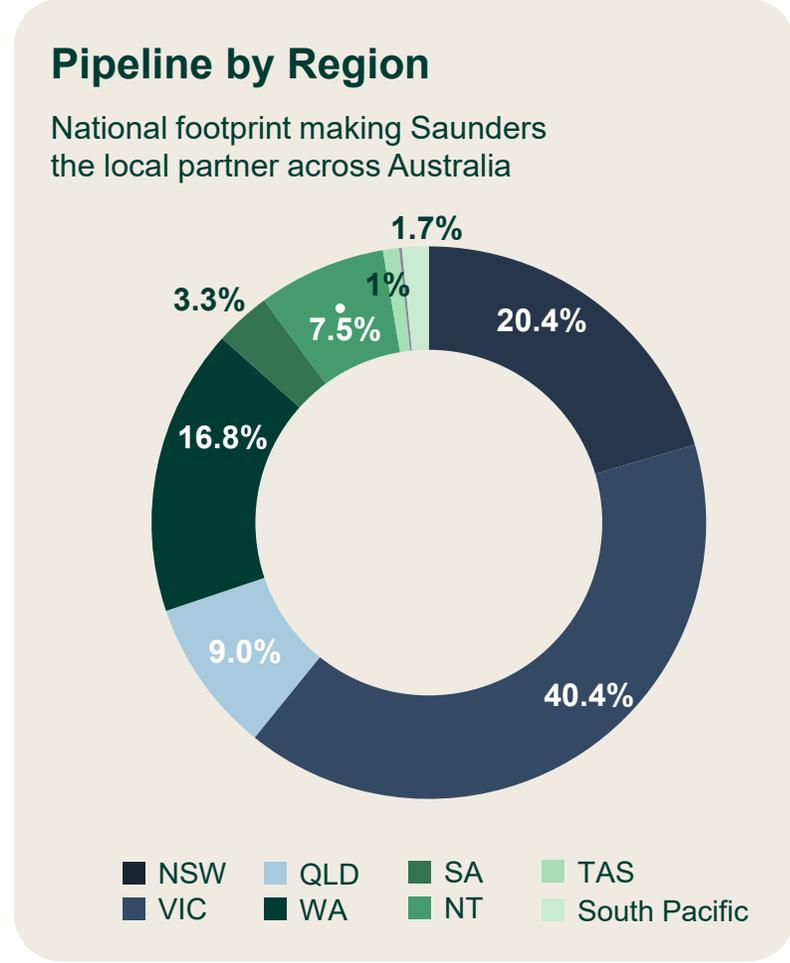
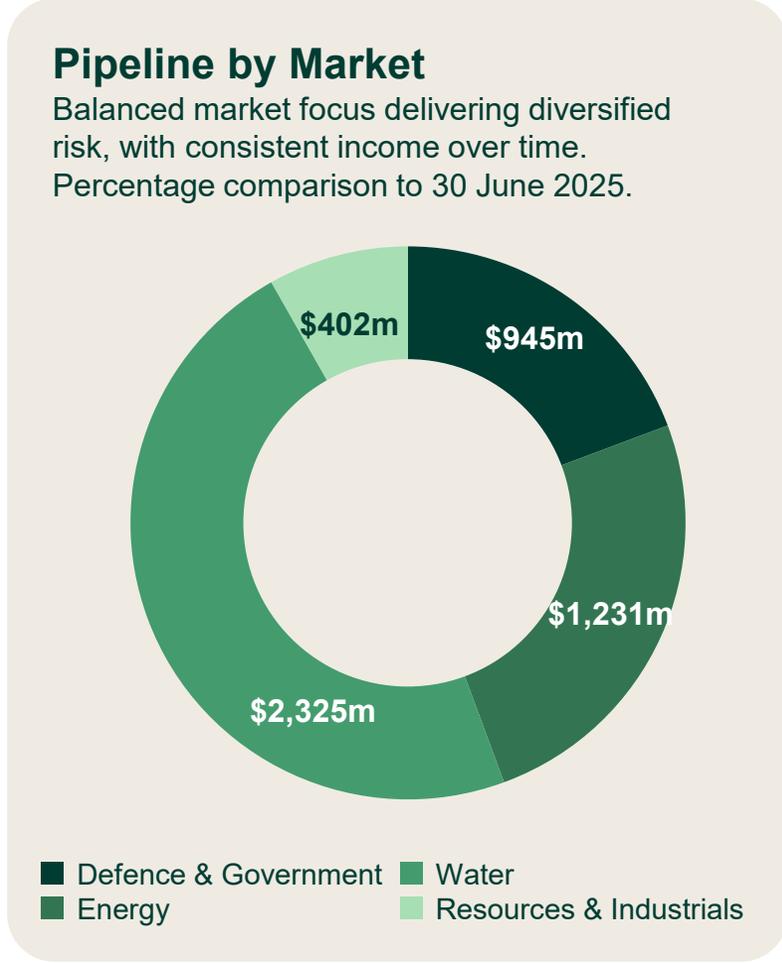
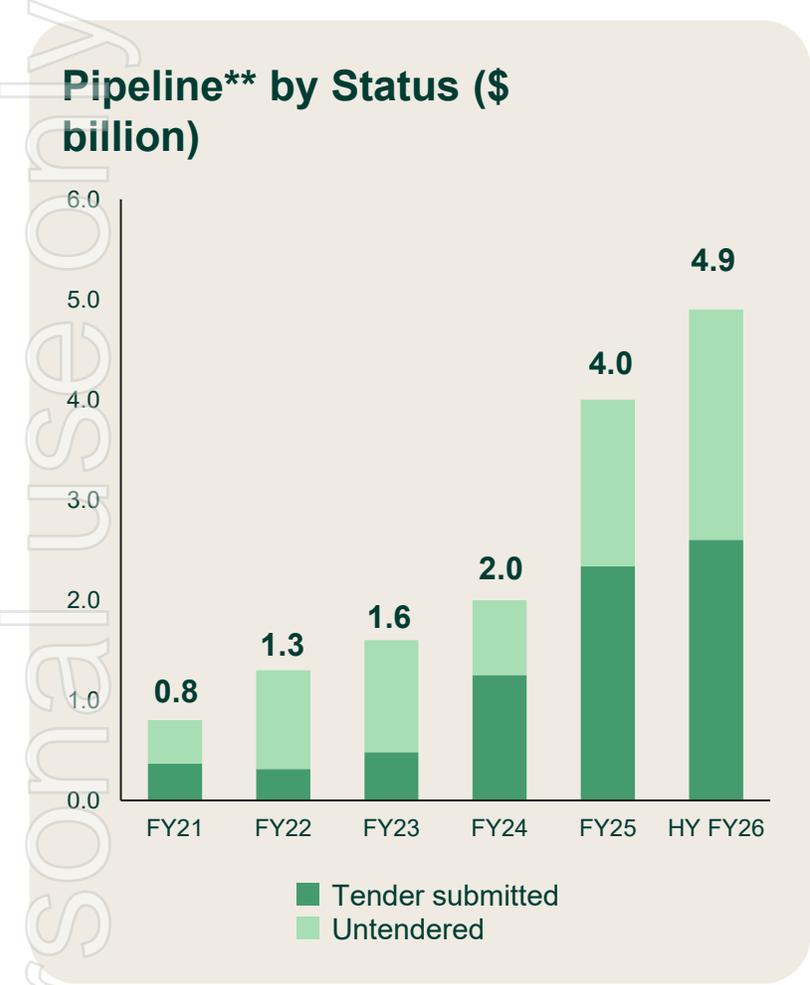

Defence & Government Major Projects Secured

RAAF Base Learmonth Fuel Infrastructure, WA

Value \$20.0 million

Client CPB Contractors

Secured 18 December 2025

The scope includes the supply, installation and commissioning of approximately 3.5 km of in-ground aviation fuel hydrant piping, supported by associated civil, electrical and control systems.

Works also include an airfield lighting emergency generator fuel system, comprising diesel storage and fuel transfer infrastructure, leveraging Saunders' multidisciplinary fuel, civil and automation capabilities.

RAAF Base Darwin – OLA Fuel Skid Capability, NT

The project includes offsite fabrication of ten new Ordnance Loading Bay (OLA) fuel skids at Saunders' facility, with factory acceptance testing and pre-commissioning. Works include demolition of existing skids and installation, testing, commissioning and full control system integration.

Delivery leverages Saunders' multidisciplinary capability across structural, mechanical, piping, fabrication, electrical and instrumentation and industrial automation to enhance base capability and readiness.

Saunders has been engaged to deliver the Chilled Water Resiliency and Upgrades Program at a Defence facility in the Northern Territory, following successful delivery of multiple work packages for a long-standing client on site.

The program upgrades and extends chilled water pipelines, delivering detailed design, procurement, installation, testing and commissioning, integrity testing, and integrated civil, mechanical, piping, electrical and instrumentation works.

Violet Street Bridge Replacement, NSW

Works include demolishing the existing bridge over Narrabri Creek and constructing a new 50-metre concrete and steel-reinforced bridge to improve safety, connectivity and resilience.

Scope includes unrestricted load capacity, dual traffic lanes, shared pedestrian and cyclist pathways, upgraded road approaches, new overhead street lighting and improved flood resilience.

Scope includes the design and construction of a 120-metre, five-span precast concrete bridge, plus piling, earthworks, drainage, pavements, associated civil infrastructure, staged delivery and comprehensive traffic management.

Based on performance to date, FY2026 performance is expected to be in line with the earnings guidance provided at the AGM.



\$549m Work-In-Hand and a \$4.9b opportunity pipeline, of which \$787.8m is currently under evaluation in the short to medium term, provide runway for long-term earnings resilience.



Increasing exposure to niche, high-compliance critical infrastructure markets strengthens earnings resilience and reinforces high barriers to entry.



A higher-quality earnings profile is being driven by a portfolio shift toward long-term, multi-year Panel and Master Services Agreements, supporting annuity-style and recurring earnings.



Diversification strategy to broaden the service offering has successfully delivered new market opportunities including ECI and has increased brand recognition as a service provider with multi-disciplinary capabilities.
