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Directors' Report

for the half year ended 31 December 2025

Your directors submit their report, together with the financial statements of the consolidated entity ("DataDot") consisting of DataDot Technology Limited ("DTL") and the entities it controlled at the end of or during the half year ended 31 December 2025.

Principal activities

The principal activities of DataDot during the half year were:

- The manufacture and distribution of asset identification and digital theft protection solutions, including:
 - o DataDotDNA[®] polymer and metallic microdot technology; and
 - o DataTraceID[®], a high-security authentication solution.
- The development and provision of customised asset protection, registration and recovery solutions, including:
 - o Asset Registers – secure databases that record asset identification data for public and commercial organisations; and
 - o PropertyVAULT and VAULT branded asset protection and recovery solutions, incorporating digital registration platforms, asset databases, physical security and identification products, and managed recovery services, including insurer-aligned recovery and salvage support delivered through PropertyVAULT Insurance Services.

There has been no significant change in the nature of these activities during the half year.

Review of operations

The Group recorded a profit after tax of \$233k for the half year ended 31 December 2025, reflecting improved revenue performance and continued operational discipline across the Group's core operations.

Total revenue for the half year increased to \$1.941m, representing growth of \$391k (25.0%) compared to the prior corresponding period. The revenue increase reflects strengthened performance across key distributor markets and improving contributions from the Group's diversified product and service mix, including continued traction in DataTraceID® authentication solutions.

Cost of sales increased to \$788k, reflecting inflationary cost pressures and changes in product mix during the period. Operating expenses also increased, primarily due to continued investment in strategic growth initiatives, including the expansion of recovery-led service capability and supporting infrastructure. Despite these increases, the Group maintained profitability, demonstrating the resilience of the underlying business and the Board's continued focus on disciplined cost management.

A significant strategic development during the period has been the advancement of PropertyVAULT Insurance Services, following the successful trial implementation with a Tier 1 insurer. The trial has validated a recovery-driven operating model that has demonstrably delivered material value to the insurer through improved recovery rates and enhanced salvage outcomes on stolen and written-off insured assets. The results achieved confirm both the operational effectiveness and commercial relevance of PropertyVAULT's recovery and asset intelligence capability and provide a strong foundation for broader industry engagement.

The Board considers this validation to represent an important milestone in the Company's continued evolution from a product-based identification provider into a broader asset recovery and intelligence partner to the insurance sector.

As at 31 December 2025, the Company's balance sheet remains strong, with a solid net asset position and sufficient liquidity to support ongoing operations and strategic initiatives.

Outlook

The Company enters the second half of the financial year with a stable core business and improving revenue momentum across its established product and licensing channels. Management remains focused on strengthening distributor engagement, expanding market penetration in priority regions, and maintaining disciplined management of operating costs and working capital.

The continued development of PropertyVAULT Insurance Services represents a key growth initiative. The successful Tier 1 insurer trial has demonstrated the scalability of a recovery-

led service model capable of integration into insurer claims and recovery workflows. As insurers increasingly focus on measurable improvements in recovery performance, fraud mitigation and salvage efficiency, DataDot is well positioned to provide a differentiated solution supported by established technology, recovery expertise and expanding digital asset intelligence capabilities.

The Board remains confident that the Company's established asset identification operations provide a solid and profitable foundation, while the commercialisation and expansion of PropertyVAULT Insurance Services presents a significant medium-term growth opportunity capable of enhancing recurring revenue and strengthening long-term shareholder value.

1 Summary of significant accounting policies

The financial statements cover DataDot Technology Limited as a consolidated entity consisting of DataDot Technology Limited and its subsidiaries. The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is DataDot Technology's functional and presentation currency.

DataDot Technology Limited is a listed public company limited by shares, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

A description of the nature of the consolidated entity's operations and its principal activities are included in the directors' report, which is not part of the financial statements.

The financial statements were authorised for issue, in accordance with a resolution of directors on 26 February 2026.

Basis of preparation

These general purpose financial statements for the interim half-year reporting period ended 31 December 2025 have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134 'Interim Financial Reporting' and the Corporations Act 2001, as appropriate for for-profit oriented entities. Compliance with AASB 134 ensures compliance with International Financial Reporting Standard IAS 34 'Interim Financial Reporting'.

These general purpose financial statements do not include all the notes of the type normally included in annual financial statements. Accordingly, these financial statements are to be read in conjunction with the annual report for the year ended 30 June 2025 and any public announcements made by the Company during the interim reporting period in accordance with the continuous disclosure requirements of the Corporations Act 2001.

The principal accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year and corresponding interim reporting period, unless otherwise stated.

Amended Standards Adopted by the Group

The Group has adopted all of the new and revised Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (the AASB) that are relevant to their operations and effective for the current half-year.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

8 Segment Information

Segment descriptions

DataDot has identified its operating segments based on the internal reports that are reviewed and used by the executive management team (the chief operating decision makers) in assessing performance and in determining the allocation of resources.

Management has reviewed the segments and determined the group is organised into business units based on their product and services and accordingly has three reportable segments. Discrete financial information about each of these operating businesses is reported to the executive management team on at least a monthly basis.

Products and services by segment

Three reportable segments have been identified as follows:

OEMs and Distributors – the manufacture and wholesale supply of DataDotDNA[®] polymer and metallic microdots to manufacturers (OEMs) for application to their own products, and to authorised distributors and wholesale customers in overseas markets for on-sale under their own brands. Revenues in this segment include royalties and licensing fees associated with these distributorships.

DataTracelD[®] – a high speed, high security, machine readable system for authenticating materials, products, and assets.

Direct Business and Consumer sales – all activities that have a direct to business and/or consumer focus and includes on-line, retail and dealer sales of the newly developed range of DatadotDNA products kits, Vault branded security products, and Vault facilitated stolen property recovery and insurance sales commissions.

Accounting policies and intersegment transactions

The accounting policies used by DataDot in reporting segments internally is the same as those contained in the prior period with the exception of the new policies adopted as disclosed in Note 1. The adoption of these policies did not have a material impact on segment reporting. Intersegment pricing is determined on an arm's length basis. Intersegment transactions are eliminated on consolidation.

The following tables present the revenue, profit/(loss) before tax, assets and liabilities information regarding operating segments for half years ended 31 December 2025 and 31 December 2024.
