Binding Agreement to Acquire Hammer Metals

Providing second district scale project development opportunity

Acquisition Highlights

- Tactical and strategic acquisition to expand Mt Isa, Queensland copper holdings with a strong outlook for copper and global copper demand forecast to increase
- Larvotto Resources to acquire 100% of Hammer Metals by way of a Board recommended Scheme of Arrangement
- Hammer shareholders to receive 1 Larvotto share for every 22 Hammer shares held, representing an implied offer price of \$0.06 per Hammer share¹, implying an equity value for Hammer of approximately \$54 million²
- Transaction unanimously recommended by Hammer Board, in the absence of a superior proposal and subject to an Independent Expert Report concluding that the Scheme is in the best interests of Hammer shareholders
- Larvotto is building an Australian critical minerals and precious metals portfolio with antimony and gold production set to commence at Hillgrove in August 2026
- Larvotto's Mt Isa strategy provides a second district scale opportunity for copper and gold development
- Full scrip consideration allows Larvotto to utilise capital to advance assets and Hammer shareholders to benefit from future growth of the enlarged Larvotto portfolio
- Larvotto to acquire Hammer Metals' Mt Isa portfolio comprising copper, gold, and critical mineral assets
- Placement of \$15 million at a 15% premium demonstrates significant support for advancing Larvotto's Mt Isa strategy
 - Strategic investment by Glencore will fund accelerated progression of Larvotto's Queensland copper strategy
 - Placement bolsters Larvotto's strong financial position with near-term cashflow anticipated from antimony and gold production
- Enlarged Larvotto group expected to have a pro forma market capitalisation of approximately \$871m

Strategic Rationale

- Acquisition advances Larvotto's strategy to build a leading, Australian critical minerals and precious metals company with a focus on antimony, gold and copper production
- Larvotto has demonstrated that it can rapidly move projects forward into production and sees strong potential through the combined Larvotto and Hammer Queensland copper assets to become an emerging copper producer

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- Acquisition creates a district-scale Queensland copper portfolio comprising ~530k CuEq³ of resources in the Mt Isa region, located proximal to existing and under-utilised processing facilities
- Acquisition includes the Kalman Project in Mt Isa, which hosts a significant JORC Resource of 39.2Mt at 1.27% CuEq for 420kt contained CuEq metal⁴
- Recent drilling at Kalman returned results including:
 - 124m @ 2.2% CuEqRec from 186m
 - 30m @ 3.98% CuEqRec from 195m⁵
- Hammer Metals has strategic partnerships with Glencore and South 32
- Larvotto maintains an established, independent technical and operational team in Mt Isa
- Larvotto to accelerate resource growth and regional drilling across the enlarged Mt Isa tenure and to commence development studies with dedicated capital to support activities

Larvotto Resources Limited (**ASX: LRV**, 'Larvotto' or 'the Company') is pleased to advise it has entered into a binding Scheme Implementation Deed ("SID") under which Larvotto will acquire 100% of Hammer Metals Limited (**ASX: HMX**) ("Hammer") by way of a Court-approved Scheme of Arrangement under Part 5.1 of the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth) ("Scheme") ("the Transaction").

The Transaction combines Larvotto's near-term producing Hillgrove Antimony-Gold Project in NSW with Hammer's advanced district-scale Mt Isa copper and critical minerals portfolio in Queensland, creating an Australian critical minerals and precious metals company with near-term production, strategic antimony exposure and a substantial copper growth platform based around a resource of ~530k tonnes of copper equivalent metal⁶.

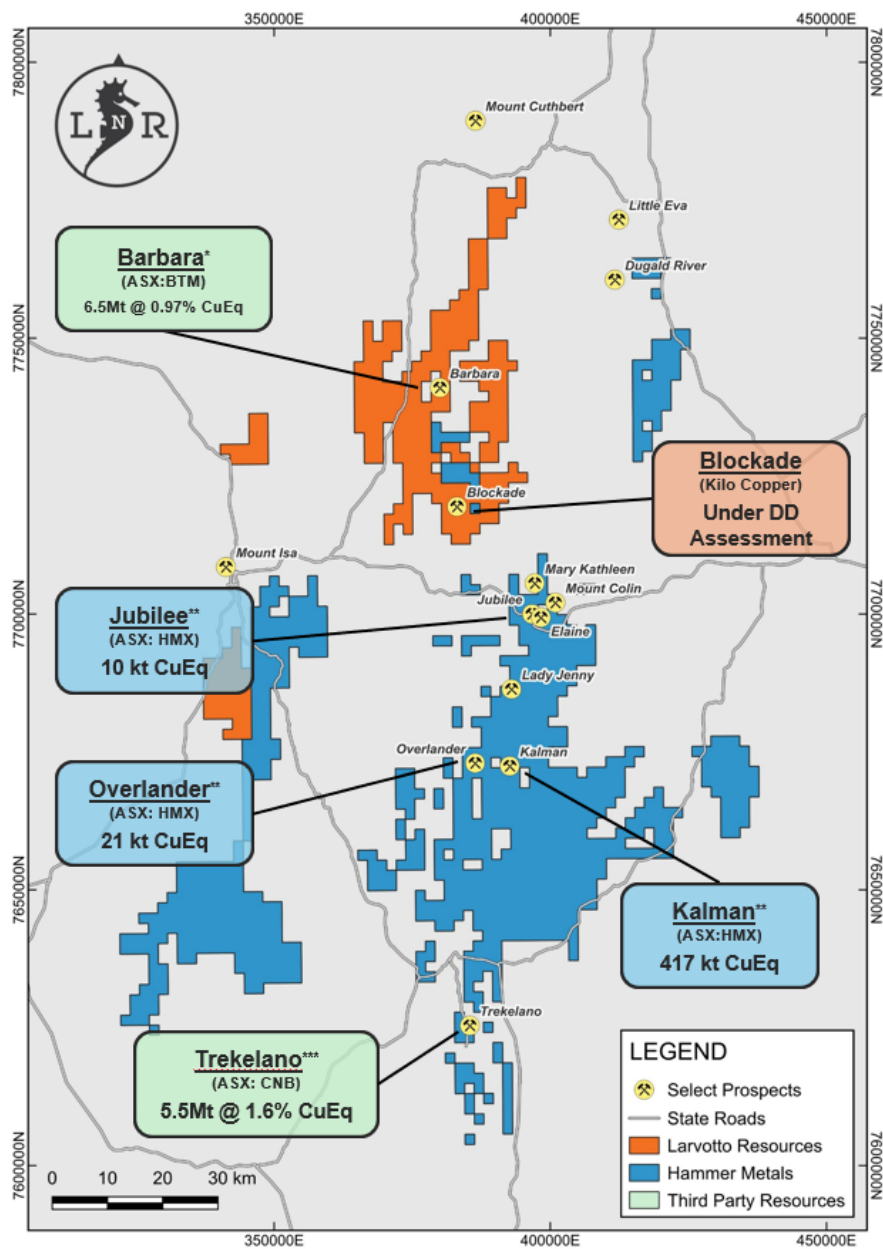


Figure 1 Location of Larvotto Resources (LRV) and Hammer Metals (HMX) tenure in the Mt Isa Region⁸

The Hammer acquisition materially expands Larvotto's existing Queensland copper strategy and land holding (Figure 1). Hammer's portfolio is highly complementary to Larvotto's Mt Isa Project and combined with the Company's option to acquire the historic Blockade Copper Mine, creates a consolidated regional copper platform capable of supporting multiple development and exploration pathways across the Mt Isa district.

Upon implementation, Larvotto will add ~ 530kt CuEq⁷ of JORC Resources through Hammer's Mt Isa asset base, creating a significant copper and critical minerals development platform in the Mt Isa region.

The enlarged Larvotto group will offer investors a unique combination of:

- Near-term cash flow anticipated from Hillgrove production
- Exposure to a globally significant antimony asset

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- A district-scale copper and critical minerals development portfolio
- Exposure to diversified critical minerals including copper, molybdenum and rhenium, with additional gold resources, in addition to Larvotto’s existing antimony and tungsten
- Significant resource growth, exploration upside and project development across an enlarged Australian portfolio
- Demonstrated track record of securing significant financing to enable timely project progression
- A development team with a track record of rapid delivery on production outcomes and building a skilled mining workforce

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Transaction Summary

Under the terms of the Scheme, Hammer shareholders will receive 1 new Larvotto share for every 22 Hammer shares held at the Scheme Record Date ("**Scheme Consideration**").

The all-scrip structure enables Hammer shareholders to retain exposure to the development upside of Hammer's Queensland assets, while participating in the near-term production and cash flow potential of Larvotto's Hillgrove Antimony-Gold Project.

Based on Larvotto's closing price of \$1.33 on Friday 5 June⁷, the Scheme Consideration implies:

- An offer price of \$0.06 per Hammer share;
- A fully diluted equity value for Hammer of approximately \$54 million; and
- A premium of 18% to Hammer's closing share price of \$0.051 per share on 4 June 2026⁸.

Following implementation of the Scheme, existing Larvotto shareholders and Hammer shareholders are expected to own approximately 92.7% and 7.3%⁹ respectively of the combined group, prior to completion of the strategic placement to Glencore.

In addition to the Scheme Consideration, Hammer shareholders will receive shares in Yandal Gold Co, containing Hammer's West Australian gold assets which will be distributed to Hammer shareholders by way of an in-specie capital reduction, pursuant to s.256 of the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth) and requiring an ordinary resolution of Hammer shareholders. The Scheme is conditional upon the separation of the West Australian gold assets from Hammer.

The Scheme is unanimously recommended by the Board of Hammer. Each director of Hammer has committed to vote all shares in Hammer which they control (equivalent to approximately 7% of Hammer shares) in favour of the Scheme, in the absence of a superior proposal and subject to the independent expert opining that the Scheme is in the best interests of Hammer shareholders. Major Hammer shareholders, who collectively control 144.8 million shares in Hammer (representing approximately 16% of Hammer) also support the Scheme and have provided voting intention statements confirming that they intend to vote in favour of the Scheme, subject to no superior proposal emerging and subject to the independent expert (to be appointed by Hammer) concluding, and continuing to conclude, that the Scheme is in the best interests of Hammer shareholders.

Additionally, Larvotto is to provide Hammer with liquidity for the period prior to the Scheme becoming effective, through an unsecured debt financing facility to Hammer of up to \$4 million. The key terms of the debt facility (including obligations for repayment) are considered typical for a financing arrangement such as this in the context of a change of control transaction.

Management Commentary

Ron Heeks, Managing Director of Larvotto Resources commented:

"This transaction is a highly compelling tactical and strategic fit that significantly strengthens Larvotto's position as an emerging Australian critical minerals and precious metals company."

Hammer has assembled one of the most attractive undeveloped copper and critical minerals portfolios in the Mt Isa district. By combining the Hammer assets with our adjacent Mt Isa Project we are creating a district-scale copper portfolio with the resource inventory and development optionality to become a major participant in the region.

The acquisition comes at an important time with Larvotto transitioning into production at Hillgrove. We recently announced a seven-year gold concentrate offtake agreement for Hillgrove with Glencore, and building on that relationship, Glencore has become a strategic investor in support of Larvotto's copper strategy. The anticipated cash flow from Hillgrove and Glencore's \$15 million investment provides a strong foundation to accelerate Larvotto's next stage of growth.

We believe the combination creates a unique investment proposition, offering shareholders exposure to near-term gold and antimony production, a globally significant strategic antimony asset, and one of the largest copper and critical minerals development portfolios in the world-class Mt Isa region. Few ASX-listed mining companies provide meaningful exposure to multiple critical minerals alongside a near-term producing asset, strongly differentiating Larvotto within the Australian resources sector.

We look forward to welcoming Hammer shareholders onto our register and working together with our strong business partners such as Glencore to unlock the significant value embedded across the combined asset base as we aggressively move projects into production at record high commodity prices."

Daniel Thomas, Managing Director of Hammer, commented:

"The Hammer Board believes this transaction delivers compelling value for shareholders while preserving exposure to the significant upside potential of our Queensland copper and critical minerals assets.

Over many years, Hammer has assembled a substantial resource base and exploration portfolio across the Mt Isa district. We have consistently believed these assets have the potential to support a large-scale regional development platform, and Larvotto's existing Mt Isa assets, development expertise and near-term cash flow generation provide a strong pathway to realise that potential.

The all-scrip nature of the transaction allows Hammer shareholders to continue participating in the future growth of these assets through ownership in the enlarged Larvotto group, while also gaining exposure to Hillgrove's near-term production and cash flow profile.

In addition, shareholders will retain exposure to the value of our West Australian gold assets through the proposed separation of Yandal Gold Co.

The Board unanimously supports the transaction and believes it represents the best opportunity to accelerate development of Hammer's Queensland portfolio within a larger, well-funded and more diversified Australian resources company."

Strategic Growth

District-Scale Queensland Copper and Critical Minerals Platform

The Hammer acquisition creates a district-scale Queensland copper and critical minerals platform by combining Hammer's Mt Isa portfolio with Larvotto's existing Mt Isa Project and option over the historic Blockade Copper Mine. The broader Mt Isa regional copper growth and development strategy will follow Larvotto's accelerated pathway to production at its Hillgrove Mine in NSW.



The enlarged Mt Isa portfolio comprises ~530kt CuEq¹⁰ of JORC Resources across multiple deposits, including the Kalman, Elaine, Jubilee, Overlander and Lakeview Projects, providing Larvotto with increased scale, resource inventory and development optionality.

The Hammer acquisition creates a consolidated regional platform for Larvotto, capable of supporting multiple development and exploration pathways over the longer term.

Larvotto's Development Capability Leveraged

Through its progression of the Hillgrove Antimony-Gold Project, Larvotto has established a strong track record of advancing mining projects through feasibility, financing and development. Since acquiring Hillgrove in late 2023, the Company has completed feasibility studies, secured project financing, upgraded infrastructure and progressed the project towards production which is anticipated to commence in August 2026.

Larvotto intends to apply its technical, operational and financial expertise to Hammer's Queensland asset base, accelerating resource growth, development studies and project advancement.

Hillgrove Underpins the Next Stage of Growth

The Transaction merges a broad portfolio of assets at complementary stages of development. Production at Larvotto's Hillgrove Antimony-Gold Project is expected to commence in August 2026. Production from Hillgrove has the potential to generate significant cash flow at a time when Hammer's Queensland copper assets enter the next phase of resource definition, study work and development assessment.

The combination provides Larvotto with a clear pathway to fund and accelerate advancement of its enlarged Queensland copper portfolio, whilst maintaining exposure to the strong outlook for both gold and antimony through Hillgrove production.

Unique ASX Critical Minerals and Precious Metals Company

The enlarged Larvotto group will provide investors with a differentiated combination of near-term production, strategic critical minerals exposure and long-term growth opportunities. The combined portfolio offers exposure to antimony and gold through Hillgrove, copper through the expanded Mt Isa platform, and additional critical minerals including molybdenum and rhenium through the Kalman Project.

Strengthened Funding Capacity and Strategic Partnerships Accelerate Value Creation

The Transaction is expected to significantly enhance Larvotto's financial capacity and strategic positioning, with a strong cash position of approximately \$99m¹¹ and market capitalisation of approximately \$871m¹².

In conjunction with the acquisition, Larvotto intends to undertake a \$15 million strategic placement to Glencore, providing additional capital to accelerate development activities across the Queensland copper portfolio.

The placement, together with expected future cash flow from Hillgrove, strengthens Larvotto's ability to advance multiple growth initiatives simultaneously. The investment from Glencore provides further

validation of the strategic merit of the enlarged Queensland copper platform and reflects the quality and scale of the combined asset portfolio.

Benefits to Hammer Shareholders

The Transaction provides Hammer shareholders with:

- Immediate value realisation at an attractive premium;
- Ongoing exposure to the development upside of Hammer's Queensland assets through ownership of Larvotto shares;
- Exposure to Hillgrove's near-term antimony and gold production and expected cash flow generation;
- Access to Larvotto's demonstrated capability to finance, develop and advance mining projects towards production;
- Participation in a larger and well-funded ASX-listed critical minerals and precious metals company;
- Increased scale, market relevance and ASX trading liquidity;
- Reduced reliance on future equity market funding to advance Hammer's Queensland asset portfolio;
- Continued exposure to Hammer's West Australian gold assets through ownership of Yandal Gold Co shares; and
- Potential capital gains tax rollover relief.

Benefits to Larvotto Shareholders

The Transaction provides Larvotto shareholders with:

- A district-scale Queensland copper and critical minerals platform centred on the Mt Isa region, comprising the Kalman, Elaine, Jubilee, Overlander and Lakeview Projects together with Larvotto's existing Mt Isa and Blockade option assets;
- Exposure to ~530kt CuEq¹³ of JORC Resources and a substantial pipeline of development and exploration opportunities;
- Enhanced exposure to strategically important critical minerals including copper, molybdenum and rhenium;
- A clear pathway to leverage future Hillgrove production and improving financial capacity to support growth across an expanded Queensland copper platform;
- Enhanced funding capacity through the concurrent strategic placement to Glencore; and
- Additional development optionality through a larger and more diversified Australian asset portfolio.

Hammer Metals Overview

Hammer Metals is an Australian copper, gold and critical minerals company with projects in the Mt Isa region of northwest Queensland and the Yandal Gold Belt in Western Australia.

At its Mt Isa Project, Hammer has established a substantial multi-commodity resource inventory comprising copper, gold, molybdenum, silver and rhenium, with more than 530kt of copper equivalent JORC Resources.

Hammer's flagship Kalman Critical Metals Project hosts a JORC 2012 Mineral Resource and is subject to ongoing resource definition. Hammer controls more than 3,600km² of tenure in the Mt Isa district and has assembled a portfolio of copper-gold and critical minerals projects with both development and exploration upside. The Company's strategy is centred on building a potential hub-and-spoke operating model anchored around Kalman and nearby satellite deposits including Overlander, Jubilee and Lakeview.

The Company also maintains a significant gold exploration position in the highly prospective Yandal Gold Belt of Western Australia, where it is advancing the Orelia North Gold Deposit alongside multiple regional exploration targets.

Hammer's portfolio is supported by strategic partnerships and joint ventures with major international mining companies including Glencore and South32, providing technical validation and reducing exploration funding requirements.

Board Recommendation

The Board of Hammer unanimously recommends that Hammer shareholders vote in favour of the Scheme, in the absence of a superior proposal and subject to the Independent Expert concluding (and continuing to conclude) that the Scheme is in the best interests of Hammer shareholders.

The Hammer Directors have also entered into voting deed polls agreeing to vote all Hammer shares held or controlled by them, representing approximately 7% of Hammer shares on issue, in favour of the Scheme, subject to those same qualifications.

Equity Raising

Larvotto has also secured a commitment for a \$15 million equity raising through a placement to Glencore with new Larvotto shares issued to Glencore at \$1.53 per share.

The placement price represents a 15% premium to Larvotto's closing share price on 5 June 2026, the last trading day for Larvotto shares prior to Larvotto shares being placed in Trading Halt ahead of announcement of the Transaction.

Settlement of the placement is conditional upon implementation of the Scheme.

Proceeds will be used to:

- Accelerate drilling at Kalman and Jubilee;
- Advance studies across the combined Queensland copper portfolio;
- Support development activities following completion of the Transaction; and



- Provide additional balance sheet flexibility.

Conditions of the Scheme

Implementation of the Scheme is subject to conditions including:

- Approval by Hammer shareholders;
- Approval by the Federal Court of Australia;
- Regulatory approvals;
- Approval of the Yandal Gold Co separation from Hammer;
- The Independent Expert concluding that the Scheme is in the best interests of Hammer shareholders;
- No material adverse change or prescribed occurrence occurring in relation to either Larvotto or Hammer; and
- Other customary conditions for a transaction of this nature.

Copper is the dominant metal of the Kalman mineral system and it generated the highest proportion of revenue from the deposit at the time of the resource estimation.

Assumed Metallurgical Recoveries

Based on the testing completed and the current understanding of the material characteristics it has been assumed that the Kalman material can be processed using a “typical” concentrator process flowsheet. The mass balance and stage metallurgical recovery of the four major elements were based on the metallurgical test results from the molybdenum zone sample and benchmarks. The final overall recovery (table below) was established from the mass balance and benchmarked against other operations and projects.

It is the company’s opinion that the metals used in the metal equivalent equation have reasonable potential for recovery and sale based on based on metallurgical recoveries in floatation test work undertaken to date. There are a number of well-established processing routes for copper-molybdenum deposits and the sale of the resulting copper and molybdenum concentrates.

Molybdenum concentrates with rhenium require roasting to capture the rhenium from the process off-gas. There are several offshore facilities that process molybdenum concentrates.

Because of the relatively small market for Re there is limited public information available for the payments of credits for rhenium. Enquiries by the company provides the company with sufficient confidence to believe that a credit for the rhenium content of the molybdenum concentrate can be obtained.
