QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDING 30 JUNE 2026

Projects - Edjudina Project

- Ultra-fine soil sampling program completed on the Yilgangee and Broken Hill Bore areas
- Approximately 500 samples collected targeting new regional priority areas on the Project with assays expected shortly
- Heritage agreement progressing well with aim to undertake heritage surveys across the Project

Corporate

M3 Mining Limited (ASX: M3M) (M3 Mining, the Company) is pleased to provide an update on corporate and exploration activities during the June 2026 Quarter. The Company is exploring for orogenic gold deposits at its Edjudina Project and sedimentary-hosted copper deposits at its Victoria Bore Project, both located in tightly held regions of Western Australia.

Recent Activities

During the quarter, The Company announced the completion of a ~500 sample ultra-fine soil program at the Yilgange and Broken Hill Bore prospects at the Edjudina Project by Ozex Exploration Services. Samples have been submitted to Labwest with results expected imminently.

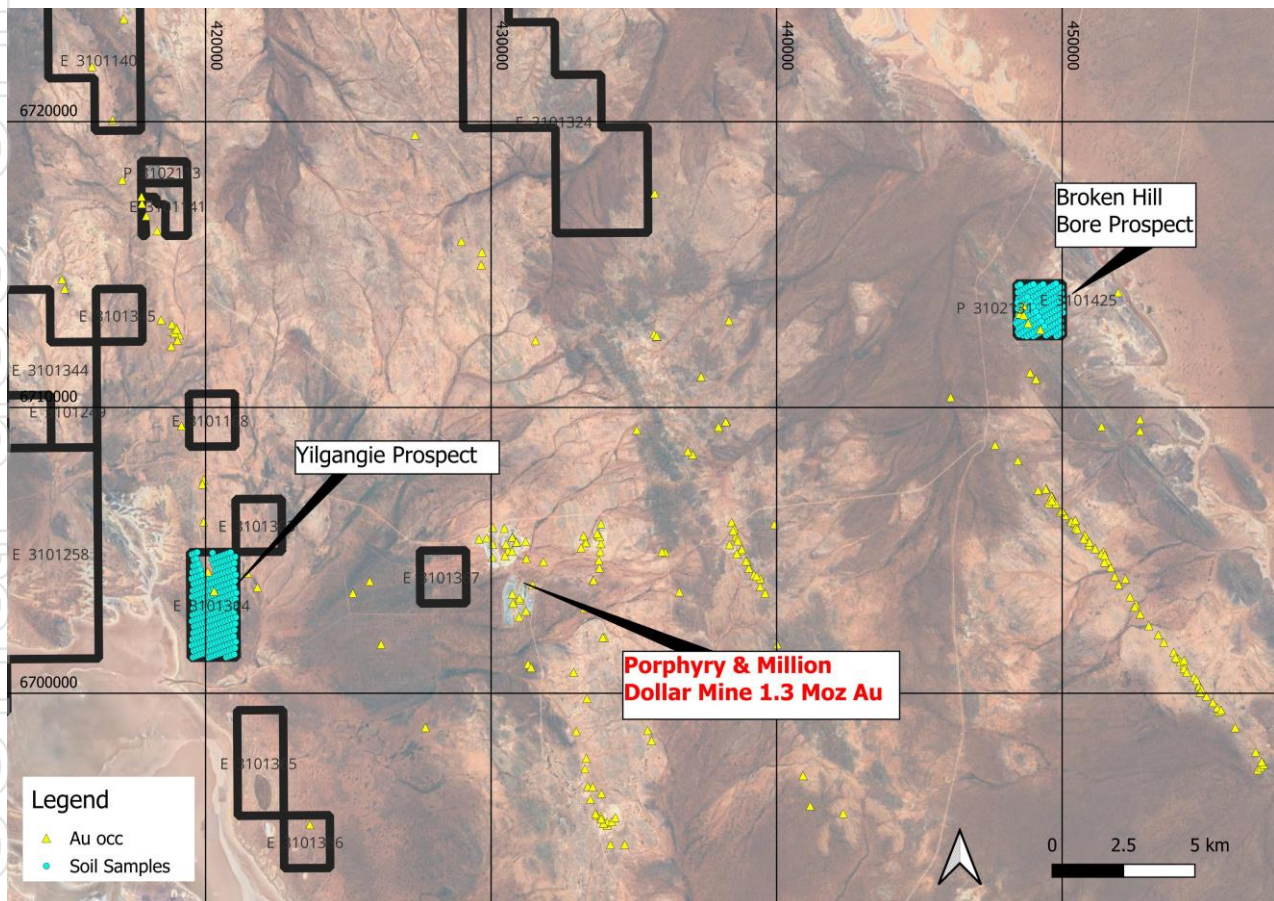


Figure 1 -Soil sampling grids on Edjudina Project¹ (see ASX Announcement 12 January 2026 for references)

Soil sampling at Yilgange aimed to define a gold trend where a number of workings are evident along the Yilgange field and historic drilling returned up to 2m @ 3.9 g/t Au from 33m including 1m @ 6.2 g/t Au¹ (Figure 4). The Yilgange prospect is hosted in alkalic intrusives similar to the Porphyry Gold Mine intrusive complex only 10 km to the east (Figure 1).

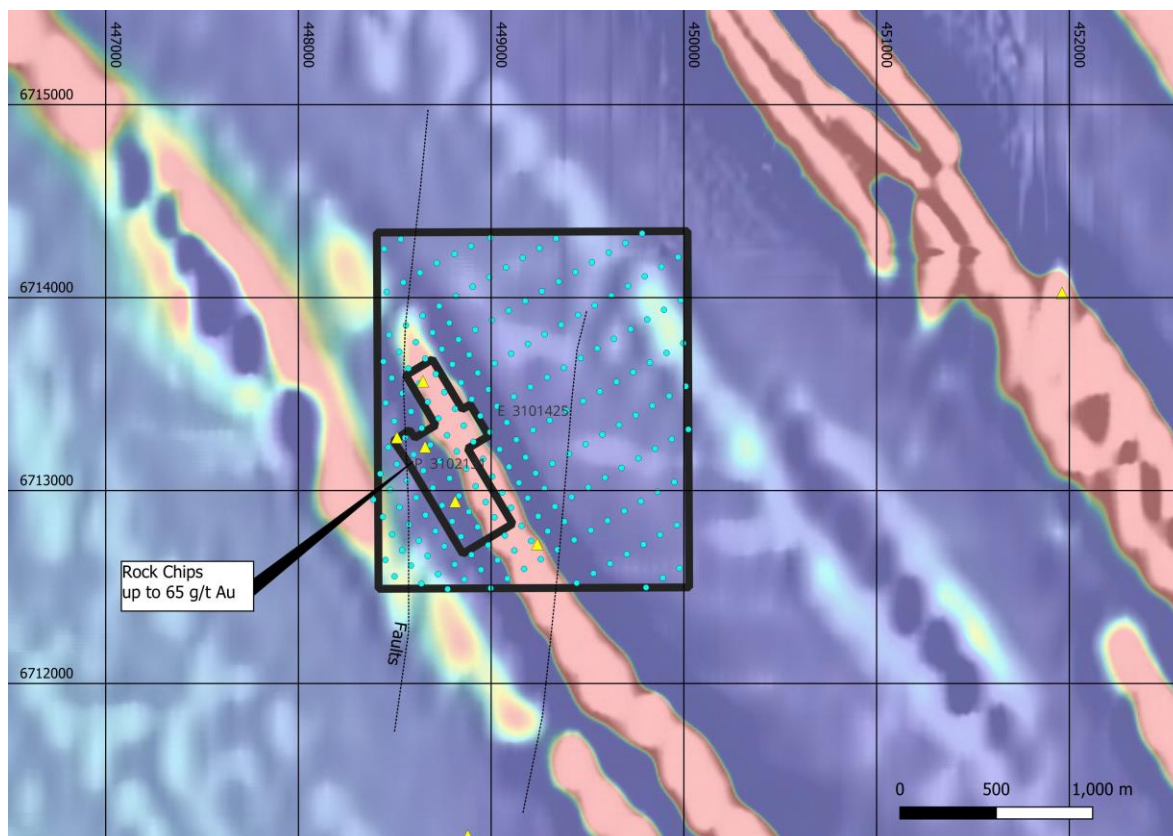


Figure 2 - Soils collected at Broken Hill Bore on TMI/RTP - 1VD aeromagnetics (refer to ASX Announcement 30 April 2025 for rock chip results)

Soil sampling at Broken Hill Bore aimed to define a gold trend hosted in BIF units along a 600m trend of gold workings that returned rock chip assays of up to 65.0 g/t Au¹ (Figure 2).

Work continues on a heritage agreement with the aim to undertake heritage surveys at Yilgange and El Capitan. Comprehensive drill planning continues in order to test the priority targets at Yilgange and El Capitan.

Edjudina Gold Project

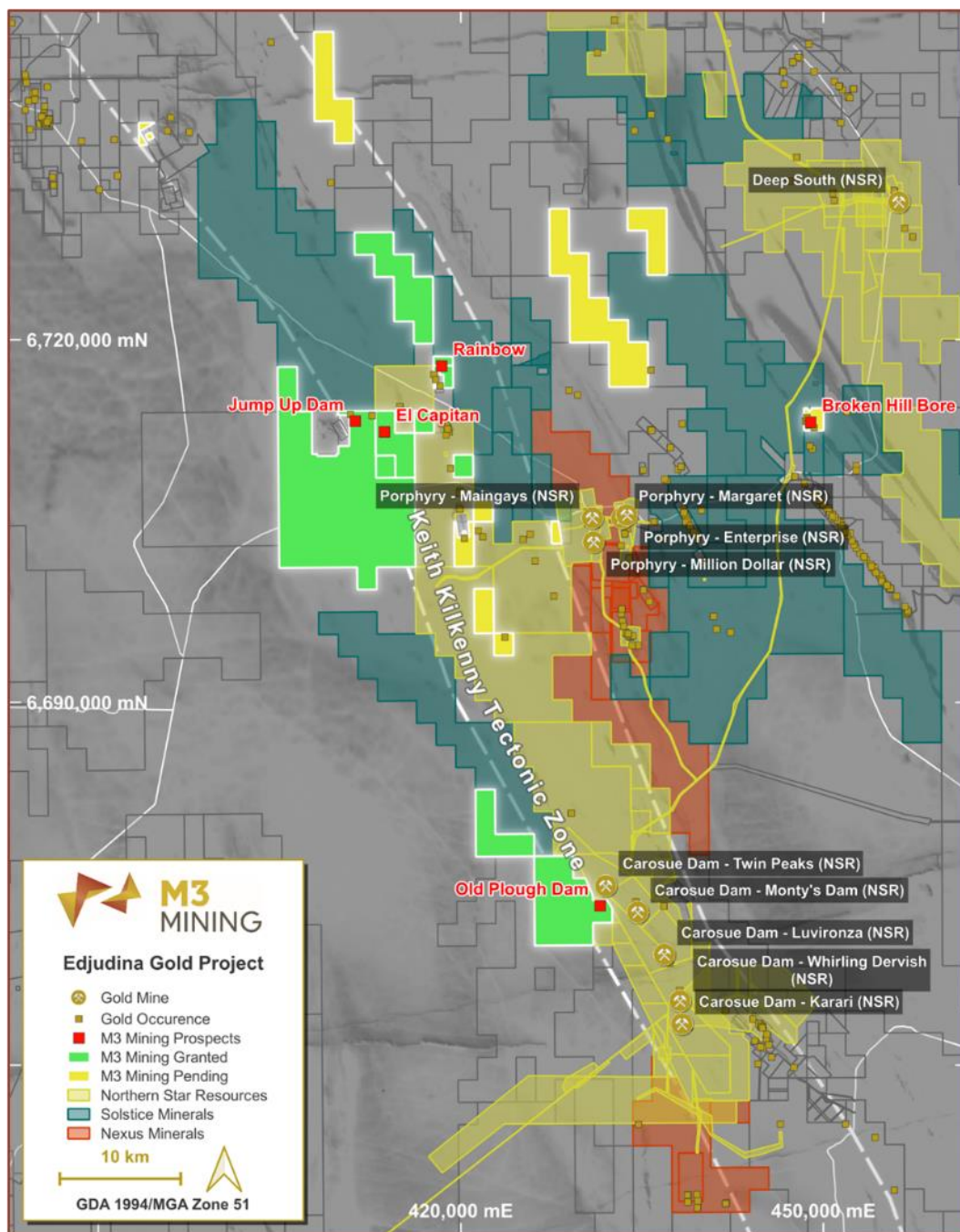


Figure 3 – Edjudina Gold Project Overview

The Edjudina Project is located approximately 150km northeast of Kalgoorlie in Western Australia. It covers a section of the established mineralised trend along the Keith-Kilkenny Tectonic Zone which hosts multiple significant gold discoveries (see Figure 3). No large-scale mining has occurred within the tenement area, however, historical near surface workings can be observed throughout the region, particularly within and along strike of the previous mines in the Yilgarn Mining Field. The Company's tenements (both granted and under application) are proximal to Northern Star's operations at both the Porphyry and Carosue Dam operations (see Figure 3).

Victoria Bore Copper Project

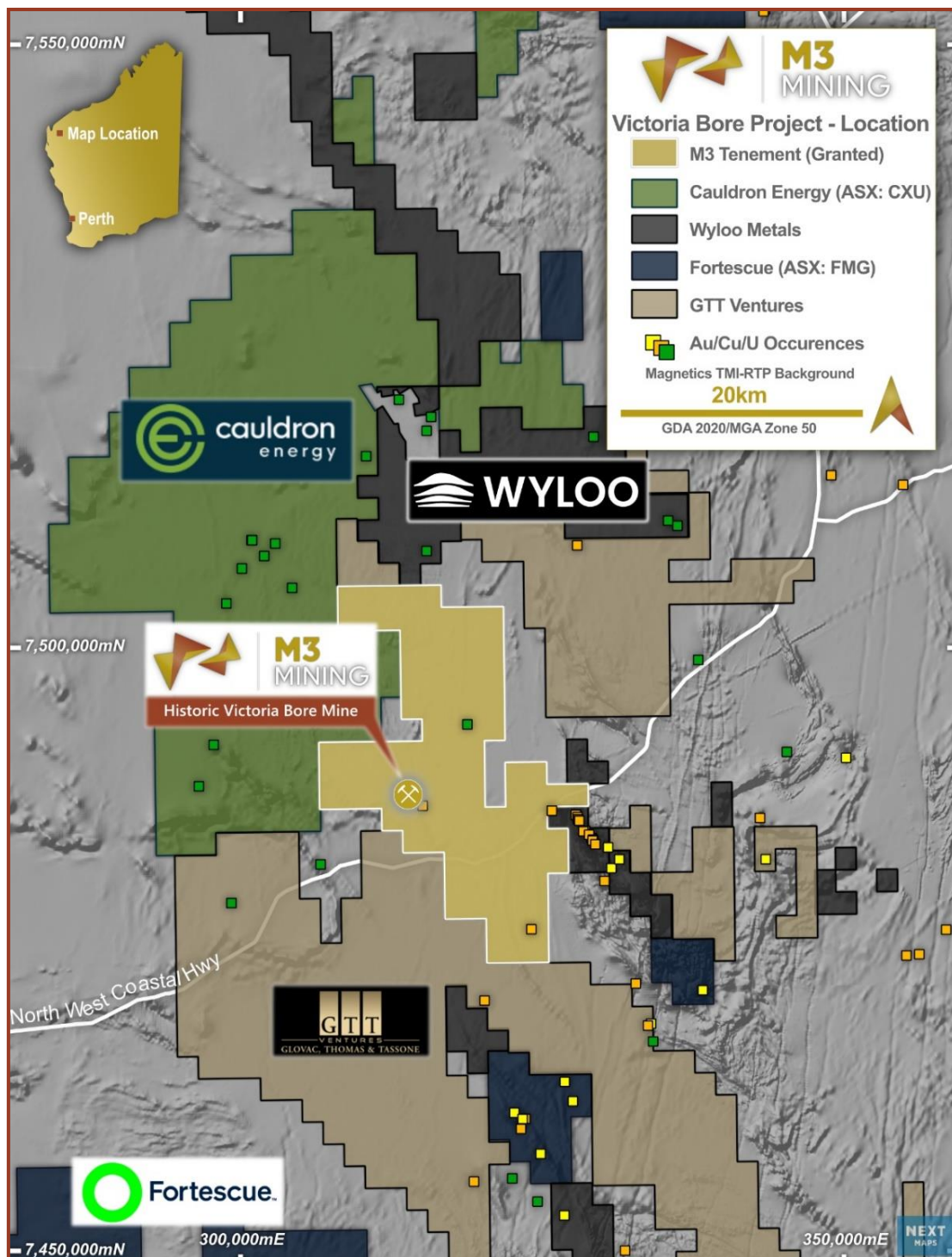


Figure 4 – Victoria Bore Copper Project Overview

The Victoria Bore Copper Project is centred on the historic Victoria Copper Mine which produced high grade copper averaging circa 32.7% Cu for 62.5t of copper from near surface in the 1950's. The Victoria Bore Project is located approximately 120km south of the town of Onslow and 130km southeast of Exmouth in Western Australia. The tenements lie adjacent to the Northwest Coastal Highway and are readily accessible (see Figure 4).
