Clearing House Electronic Sub-Register System (CHES) and Issuer Sponsorship

The Company will apply to participate in CHES, for those investors who have, or wish to have, a sponsoring stockbroker. Investors who do not wish to participate through CHES will be issuer sponsored by the Company.

Electronic sub-registers mean that the Company will not be issuing certificates to investors. Instead, investors will be provided with statements (similar to a bank account statement) that set out the number of WHKOB Options issued to them under this Prospectus. The notice will also advise holders of their Holder Identification Number or Security Holder Reference Number and explain, for future reference, the sale and purchase procedures under CHES and issuer sponsorship.

Electronic sub-registers also mean ownership of securities can be transferred without having to rely upon paper documentation. Further monthly statements will be provided to holders if there have been any changes in their security holding in the Company during the preceding month.

1.2 Shareholder Approvals

At the General Meeting, the Company obtained Shareholder approval, amongst other things, to issue a total of 139,285,715 WHKOB Options, as detailed below:

- (a) 107,142,857 WHKOB Options to unrelated professional and sophisticated investors who participated in the placement undertaken by the Company in April 2026, on the basis of one (1) free WHKOB Option for every two (2) Shares subscribed for and issued under the placement (**Placement**); and
- (b) 32,142,858 WHKOB Options to GBA Capital Pty Ltd (ACN 643 039 123) (**Lead Manager**) as part consideration for lead manager services rendered pursuant to the Placement.

Further details in respect of these WHKOB Options issues are set out in the notice of general meeting dated 29 May 2026 (**Notice of Meeting**). Refer to Section 4.1 for the full terms and conditions of the WHKOB Options.

The WHKOB Options noted above are being offered pursuant to this Prospectus for nil consideration. However, if all the WHKOB Options the subject of the Offer are exercised into Shares, the Company will receive approximately \$1,810,714. Further details in respect of the Offer are set out in Section 2.

2. Details of the offer

2.1 Background

2.1.1 Placement

The Company announced, on 15 April 2026, that it had received firm commitments from unrelated professional and sophisticated investors (**Placement Participants**) for a placement of up to 214,285,714 Shares at an issue price of \$0.007 per Share to raise approximately \$1,500,000 (before costs).

In that announcement, the Company advised that the Placement Participants would be entitled to one (1) free listed WHKOB Option for every two (2) Shares subscribed for and issued to the Placement Participants under the Placement. The WHKOB Options are exercisable at \$0.013 per WHKOB Option and expiring 31 July 2029. The full terms of the WHKOB Options are set out in Section 4.1.

The Company received Shareholder approval to issue the WHKOB Options at the General Meeting.

2.1.2 Lead Manager

The Company engaged GBA Capital Pty Ltd (ACN 643 039 123) (**Lead Manager**) to act as lead manager to the Placement. The Company agreed to pay the Lead Manager a 6% fee plus GST (i.e. approx. \$90,000) for the total amount raised under the Placement together with 32,142,858 WHKOB Options.

As set out in Section 1.2 the Company received Shareholder approval at the General Meeting to issue an aggregate of 32,142,858 WHKOB Options to the Lead Manager in consideration for lead manager services provided in connection with the Placement.

Pursuant to this Shareholder approval obtained at the General Meeting, the Lead Manager nominated Keyano Pty Ltd ACN 658 659 860 (**Keyano**) to receive Shares on its behalf.

Accordingly, Keyano is an Eligible Participant.

2.2 The Offer

This Prospectus includes an offer of up to 139,285,715 WHKOB Options.

As set out in Section 1.2, the WHKOB Options will be offered for nil consideration to:

- (a) the Placement Participants, on the basis of one (1) WHKOB Option for every two (2) Shares subscribed for and issued under the Placement; and
- (b) the Lead Manager (or its nominee), in consideration for the lead manager services provided in connection with the Placement,

(together, the **Eligible Participants**). There is no general offer of WHKOB Options.

No funds will be raised from the issue of these WHKOB Options as they are being issued for nil consideration.

The WHKOB Options offered under this Prospectus will only be issued to the Eligible Participants (or their nominee/s). Application Forms in respect of the Offer will only be provided by the Company to the Eligible Participants.

The WHKOB Options offered under the Offer will be issued on the terms and conditions set out in Section 4.1 of this Prospectus.

Any Shares issued upon the future exercise of WHKOB Options will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Please refer to Section 4.2 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to Shares.

As set out in Section 1.2, Shareholder approval for the issue of the WHKOB Options offered under the Offer was obtained at the General Meeting. Further information in respect of the General Meeting is set out in the Notice of Meeting.

2.3 Underwriting

The Offer is not underwritten.

2.4 Application for WHKOB Options

Only Eligible Participants (or their respective nominee/s) may accept the Offer. The number of WHKOB Options to which Eligible Participants are entitled is shown on the personalised Application form which accompanies this Prospectus.

2.5 Minimum subscription

There is no minimum subscription.

2.6 ASX listing

Application for Official Quotation of the WHKOB Options offered pursuant to this Prospectus will be made within 7 days after the date of this Prospectus. If the WHKOB Options are not admitted to Official Quotation by ASX before the expiration of three months after the date of this Prospectus, or such period as varied by ASIC, the Company will not issue any WHKOB Options under the Offer and will refund all application monies received under the Offer.

The fact that ASX may grant Official Quotation to the WHKOB Options is not to be taken in any way as an indication of the merits of the Company or the WHKOB Options now offered for subscription.

2.7 Issue of WHKOB Options

As set out in Section 3.1, the primary purpose of the Offer is to issue WHKOB Options as approved by Shareholders to the Eligible Participants, being Placement Participants and the Lead Manager.

If the Directors decide to issue WHKOB Options under the Offer, the issue of WHKOB Options under the Offer will take place as soon as practicable after the Closing Date. The Directors will determine the recipients of all the WHKOB Options.

The Directors reserve the right to reject any application or to allocate any Applicant fewer WHKOB Options than the number applied for.

Holding statements for WHKOB Options issued under this Prospectus will be mailed to the Eligible Participants (or their nominee/s) under the Offer.

2.8 Overseas shareholders

The Offer does not, and is not intended to, constitute an offer in any place or jurisdiction in which, or to any person to whom, it would not be lawful to make such an offer or to issue this Prospectus.

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It is not practicable for the Company to comply with the securities laws of overseas jurisdictions having regard to the number of overseas Eligible Participants, the number and value of the WHKOB Options that these Eligible Participants would be offered and the cost of complying with regulatory requirements in each relevant jurisdiction. Accordingly, the Offer is not being extended and the WHKOB Options will not be issued to Eligible Participants with a registered address which is outside Australia and New Zealand.

3. Purpose and effect of the Offer

3.1 Purpose and effect of the Offer

The principal effect of the Offer, assuming all WHKOB Options offered under this Prospectus are issued and no other Securities are issued, exercised or converted, will be to:

- (a) increase the number of Options (of all classes) on issue from 206,323,214 as at the date of this Prospectus to 345,608,929 Options following completion of the Offer;
- (b) to remove any trading restrictions attaching to Shares issued on exercise of the WHKOB Options issued under this Prospectus; and
- (c) subject to ASX granting Official Quotation of the WHKOB Options, to remove trading restrictions to the WHKOB Options so the Eligible Participants that receive the WHKOB Options will be able to trade those WHKOB Options on ASX.

No funds will be raised directly under the Offer. However, if all WHKOB Options are exercised, the Company will receive approximately \$1,810,714 in aggregate, by virtue of the payment of the exercise price.

3.4 Financial effect

The expenses of the Offer are estimated to be approximately \$20,500 including ASIC lodgement fees. The Offer is not expected to have any material financial effect on the Company.

The expenses of the Offer will be met utilising the Company's existing cash reserves.

Accordingly, the financial effect of the Offer will be to reduce the Company's existing cash reserves by \$20,500.

4. Rights and liabilities attaching to WHKOB options

4.1 Terms and conditions of WHKOB Options

(a) **Entitlement**

Each WHKOB Option entitles the holder to subscribe for one Share upon exercise of the WHKOB Option.

(b) **Exercise Price**

Subject to paragraph (i), the amount payable upon exercise of each WHKOB Option will be \$0.013 (**Exercise Price**).

(c) **Expiry Date**

Each WHKOB Option will expire at 5:00 pm (ASST) on 31 July 2029 (**Expiry Date**). A WHKOB Option not exercised before the Expiry Date will automatically lapse on the Expiry Date.

(d) **Exercise Period**

The WHKOB Options are exercisable at any time on or prior to the Expiry Date (**Exercise Period**).

(e) **Notice of Exercise**

The WHKOB Options may be exercised during the Exercise Period by notice in writing to the Company in the manner specified on the WHKOB Option certificate (**Notice of Exercise**) and payment of the Exercise Price for each WHKOB Option being exercised in Australian currency by electronic funds transfer or other means of payment acceptable to the Company.

(f) **Exercise Date**

A Notice of Exercise is only effective on and from the later of the date of receipt of the Notice of Exercise and the date of receipt of the payment of the Exercise Price for each WHKOB Option being exercised in cleared funds (**Exercise Date**).

(g) **Timing of issue of Shares on exercise**

Within five Business Days after the Exercise Date, the Company will:

- (i) issue the number of Shares required under these terms and conditions in respect of the number of WHKOB Options specified in the Notice of Exercise and for which cleared funds have been received by the Company;
- (ii) if required, give ASX a notice that complies with section 708A(5)(e) of the Corporations Act, or, if the Company is unable to issue such a notice, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors; and
- (iii) if admitted to the official list of ASX at the time, apply for official quotation on ASX of Shares issued pursuant to the exercise of the WHKOB Options.

If a notice delivered under Section 4.1(g)(iii) for any reason is not effective to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors, the Company must, no later than 20 Business Days after becoming aware of such notice being ineffective, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors.

(h) **Shares issued on exercise**

Shares issued on exercise of the WHKOB Options rank equally with the then issued shares of the Company.

(i) **Quotation of Shares issued on exercise**

Application will be made by the Company to ASX for quotation of the Shares issued upon the exercise of the WHKOB Options.

(j) **Reconstruction of capital**

If at any time the issued capital of the Company is reconstructed, all rights of an Optionholder are to be changed in a manner consistent with the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules at the time of the reconstruction.

(k) **Participation in new issues**

There are no participation rights or entitlements inherent in the WHKOB Options and holders will not be entitled to participate in new issues of capital offered to Shareholders during the currency of the WHKOB Options without exercising the WHKOB Options.

(l) **Change in exercise price**

A WHKOB Option does not confer the right to a change in Exercise Price or a change in the number of underlying securities over which the WHKOB Option can be exercised.

(m) **Transferability**

The WHKOB Options are transferable subject to any restriction or escrow arrangements imposed by ASX or under applicable Australian securities laws.

4.2 Rights and liabilities attaching to Shares

The following is a summary of the more significant rights and liabilities attaching to Shares. This summary is not exhaustive and does not constitute a definitive statement of the rights and liabilities of Shareholders. To obtain such a statement, persons should seek independent legal advice.

Full details of the rights and liabilities attaching to Shares are set out in the Constitution, a copy of which is available for inspection at the Company's registered office during normal business hours:

(a) **General meetings**

Shareholders are entitled to be present in person, or by proxy, attorney or representative to attend and vote at general meetings of the Company. The Company's constitution permits the use of technology at general meetings of

shareholders (including wholly virtual meetings) to the extent permitted under the Corporations Act, Listing Rules and applicable law.

Shareholders may requisition meetings in accordance with section 249D of the Corporations Act and the Constitution of the Company.

(b) **Voting rights**

Subject to any rights or restrictions for the time being attached to any class or classes of shares, at general meetings of shareholders or classes of shareholders:

- (i) each Shareholder entitled to vote may vote in person or by proxy, attorney or representative;
- (ii) on a show of hands, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder has one vote; and
- (iii) on a poll, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder shall, in respect of each fully paid Share held by him, or in respect of which he is appointed a proxy, attorney or representative, have one vote for each Share held, but in respect of partly paid shares shall have such number of votes as bears the same proportion to the total of such Shares registered in the Shareholder's name as the amount paid (not credited) bears to the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited).

(c) **Dividend rights**

Subject to the rights of any preference Shareholders and to the rights of the holders of any shares created or raised under any special arrangement as to dividend, the Directors may from time to time declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders entitled to the dividend which shall be payable on all Shares according to the proportion that the amount paid (not credited) is of the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited) in respect of such Shares.

The Directors may from time to time pay to the Shareholders any interim dividends as they may determine. No dividend shall carry interest as against the Company. The Directors may set aside out of the profits of the Company any amounts that they may determine as reserves, to be applied at the discretion of the Directors, for any purpose for which the profits of the Company may be properly applied.

Subject to the ASX Listing Rules and the Corporations Act, the Company may, by resolution of the Directors, implement a dividend reinvestment whereby Shareholders may elect to reinvest cash dividends paid by the Company subscribing for Shares.

(d) **Winding-up**

If the Company is wound up, the liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, divide among the Shareholders in kind the whole or any part of the property of the Company, and may for that purpose set such value as he considers fair upon any property to be so divided, and may determine how the division is to be carried out as between the Shareholders or different classes of Shareholders.

The liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, vest the whole or any part of any such property in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator thinks fit, but so that no Shareholder is compelled to accept any shares or other securities in respect of which there is any liability.

(e) **Shareholder liability**

As the Shares issued will be fully paid shares, they will not be subject to any calls for money by the Directors and will therefore not become liable for forfeiture.

(f) **Transfer of shares**

Generally, shares in the Company are freely transferable, subject to formal requirements, the registration of the transfer not resulting in a contravention of or failure to observe the provisions of a law of Australia and the transfer not being in breach of the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules.

(g) **Future increase in capital**

The issue of any new Shares is under the control of the Directors of the Company. Subject to restrictions on the issue or grant of securities contained in the ASX Listing Rules, the Constitution and the Corporations Act (and without affecting any special right previously conferred on the holder of an existing share or class of shares), the Directors may issue Shares as they shall, in their absolute discretion, determine.

(h) **Variation of rights**

Under section 246B of the Corporations Act, the Company may, with the sanction of a special resolution passed at a meeting of Shareholders vary or abrogate the rights attaching to Shares.

If at any time the share capital is divided into different classes of shares, the rights attached to any class (unless otherwise provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class), whether or not the Company is being wound up, may be varied or abrogated with the consent in writing of the holders of three quarters of the issued shares of that class, or if authorised by a special resolution passed at a separate meeting of the holders of the shares of that class.

(i) **Alteration of constitution**

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the Constitution can only be amended by a special resolution passed by at least three quarters of Shareholders present and voting at the general meeting. In addition, at least 28 days written notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution as a special resolution must be given.
