

RC drilling recommences at Pinjin as aircore drilling advances

Kalgoorlie Gold Mining (ASX:KAL) ('KalGold' or 'the Company') is pleased to report that Reverse Circulation (RC) drilling has recommenced at Pinjin, with an RC rig mobilising to site on Friday 24th July 2026. Drilling commenced over the weekend, with a total of up to 19 holes for 3,200 m planned across the Lighthorse gold prospect. Separately, aircore drilling continues over the Laverton Tectonic Zone (LTZ) Flexure targets with the program over halfway completed.

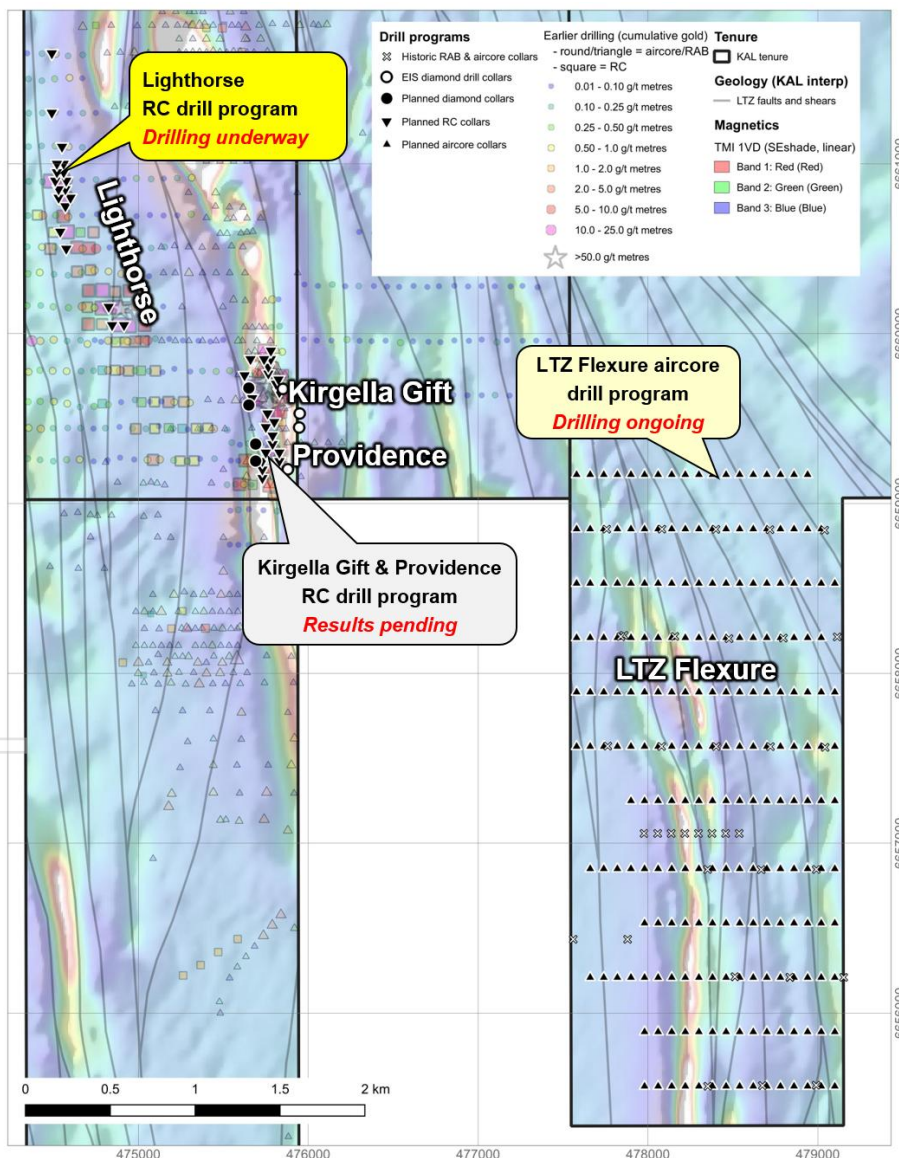


Figure 1 – RC drilling has recommenced at Pinjin, targeting the **Lighthorse** prospect (yellow label). First pass aircore drilling continues across the **LTZ Flexure** target area, systematically testing a series of gold targets for the first time. The program aims to detect near-surface anomalism for subsequent RC follow-up. Assay results from the recent **Kirgella Gift** and **Providence** RC program remain pending due to extended laboratory turnaround times. Projection: MGA 94 Zone 51.

Lighthorse RC drill program

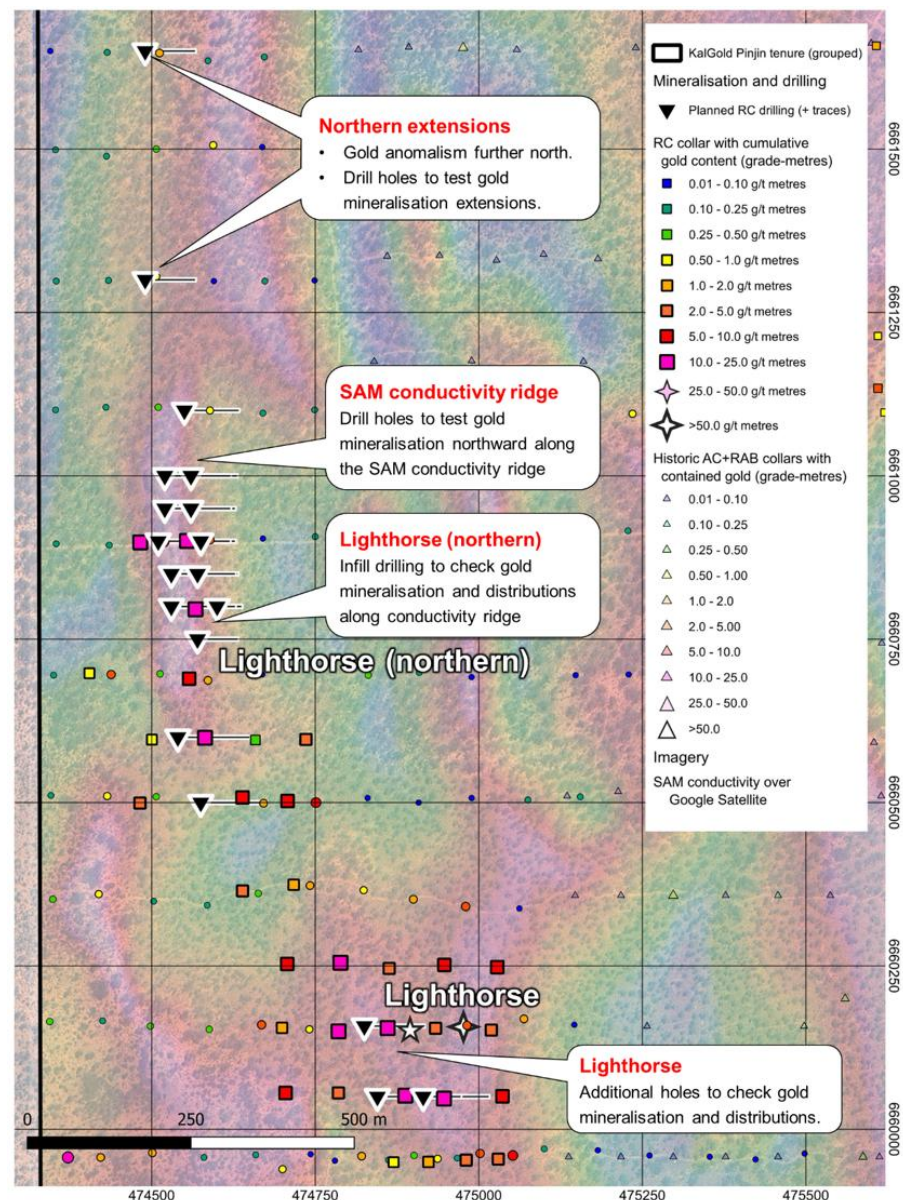


Figure 2 – Planned RC drilling at Lighthouse (black triangles) overlaid on SAM geophysical magnetometric conductivity and surface imagery. All RC drill holes dip 60 eastward, testing in and around earlier RC drill coverage (square collar points), and further northwards along the magnetometric conductivity ridge (pink underlay) which correlates with gold mineralisation intersected in previous drilling. Projection: MGA 94 Zone 51.

KalGold's last RC program at Lighthorse defined primary gold mineralisation in widely spaced holes to the north-northwest of the original discovery area (ASX:KAL 19/12/25). Importantly, mineralisation in this area

shows strong correlation with a north–south trending magneto-metric conductivity (MMC) high identified in the Company’s 2025 Sub-Audio Magnetics (SAM) survey over the Lighthouse corridor (Figure 2).

The current RC program is designed as systematic follow up, comprising:

- **Infill and extensional drilling** across the northern Lighthouse area, tightening drill spacing to approximately 50 × 40 m over the most encouraging primary gold mineralisation intersected to date.
- **Further selective infill and extension drilling** within earlier RC coverage, including around the initial Lighthouse discovery section.
- **Initial RC testing further north** on widely spaced centres along the north–south MMC geophysical anomaly.

Drilling completed to date has demonstrated that the primary gold system at Lighthouse is more extensive than initially recognised, with mineralisation remaining open to the north. All RC holes in the current program

are oriented at 60° to the east to optimally intersect steeply west-dipping structures associated with the mineralised corridor. The program is expected to take approximately three weeks to complete.

Aircore drilling update – LTZ Flexure targets

First-pass aircore drilling continues over the LTZ Flexure targets centred 3.5 km south-east of Kirgella Gift-Providence, on 100% controlled KalGold tenure (Figure 1). Approximately 140 holes have been completed, representing 55% of the planned program. Drilled hole depths have averaged approximately 35 m which is shallower than a pre-program estimate of 50 m. Although hole depths are expected to increase southwards toward the Lake Rebecca palaeodrainage system, the program is tracking positively against budget.

Geology intersected to date is consistent with KalGold’s interpretation of the LTZ Flexure area. Drilling has encountered intermediate, mafic and ultramafic units to the west (similar to the host package at Lighthouse

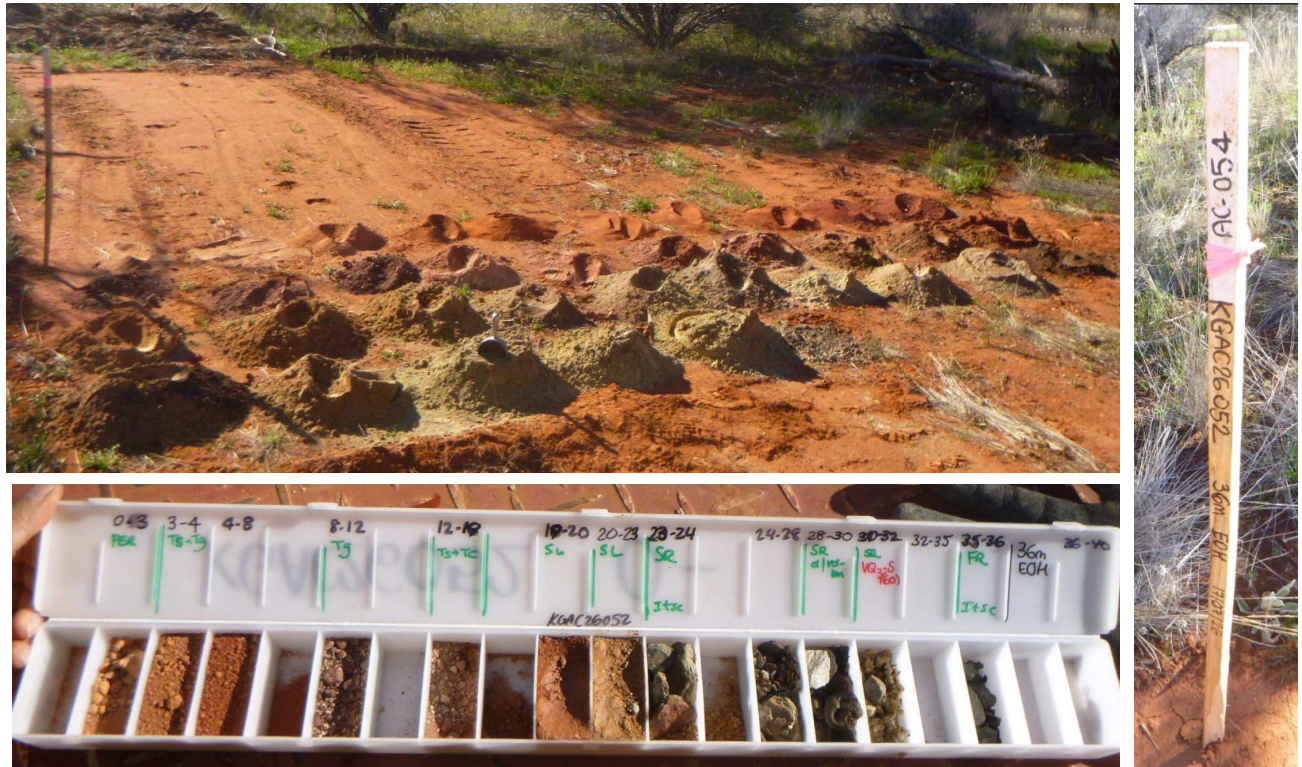


Figure 3 – An example drill site (top), archival chip tray (bottom), and collar peg (right) for drill hole KGAC26052 (6658530mN, 477820mE) from the LTZ Flexure targets. Spoil piles (top) are for every metre drilled. Sampling protocol involves 4 metre composite intervals down-hole for gold-arsenic assaying, together with a 1 metre bottom of hole (BOH) sample for multielement analysis. Archival chip trays record brief field descriptions that are subject to revision once the program is completed, showing transported (T codes), saprolitic (S codes) and fresh (F code) parts of the profile. Additional lithological descriptors and potential mineralisation indicator flags are highlighted, including intermediate schist (Itsc) and sulphidic quartz veining (VQ₃-S). Logging data is collated for all drill holes and used to assess results upon completion of the program. Samples for KGAC26052 have been submitted for assay, with results for the program to be reported in due course.

and Kirgella Gift-Providence), contrasting with granitic gneiss, granite, and amphibolites of the Rebecca Sequence in the east. The boundary between these sequences is a significant LTZ structure that curves through the Flexure target area, and is marked by shearing, quartz veining and multiple alteration styles observed in drilling to date (Figure 3).

Aircore drilling (Figure 4) is expected to be completed in the coming weeks.

Laboratory assay turnaround time update

Assay turnaround times for the Kirgella Gift and Providence RC program (completed late May 2026) have been significantly longer than anticipated due to industry-wide demand. The laboratory has advised that turnaround times should moderate to more typical levels over the coming months. KalGold expects to receive all remaining RC drill results shortly and will release them once assessed and interpreted.

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About the Pinjin Project

The Pinjin Gold Project is located in a Tier One location approximately 140 km northeast of Kalgoorlie Boulder and covers a substantial portion of the southern part of the prolific Laverton Tectonic Zone (LTZ). To the north, this major crustal structure hosts some of the Eastern Goldfields' largest gold mines and deposits.

The project is strategically located near Ramelius Resources' (ASX: RMS) Rebecca Gold Project, where a recent pre-feasibility study outlined a path to gold production by 2027.

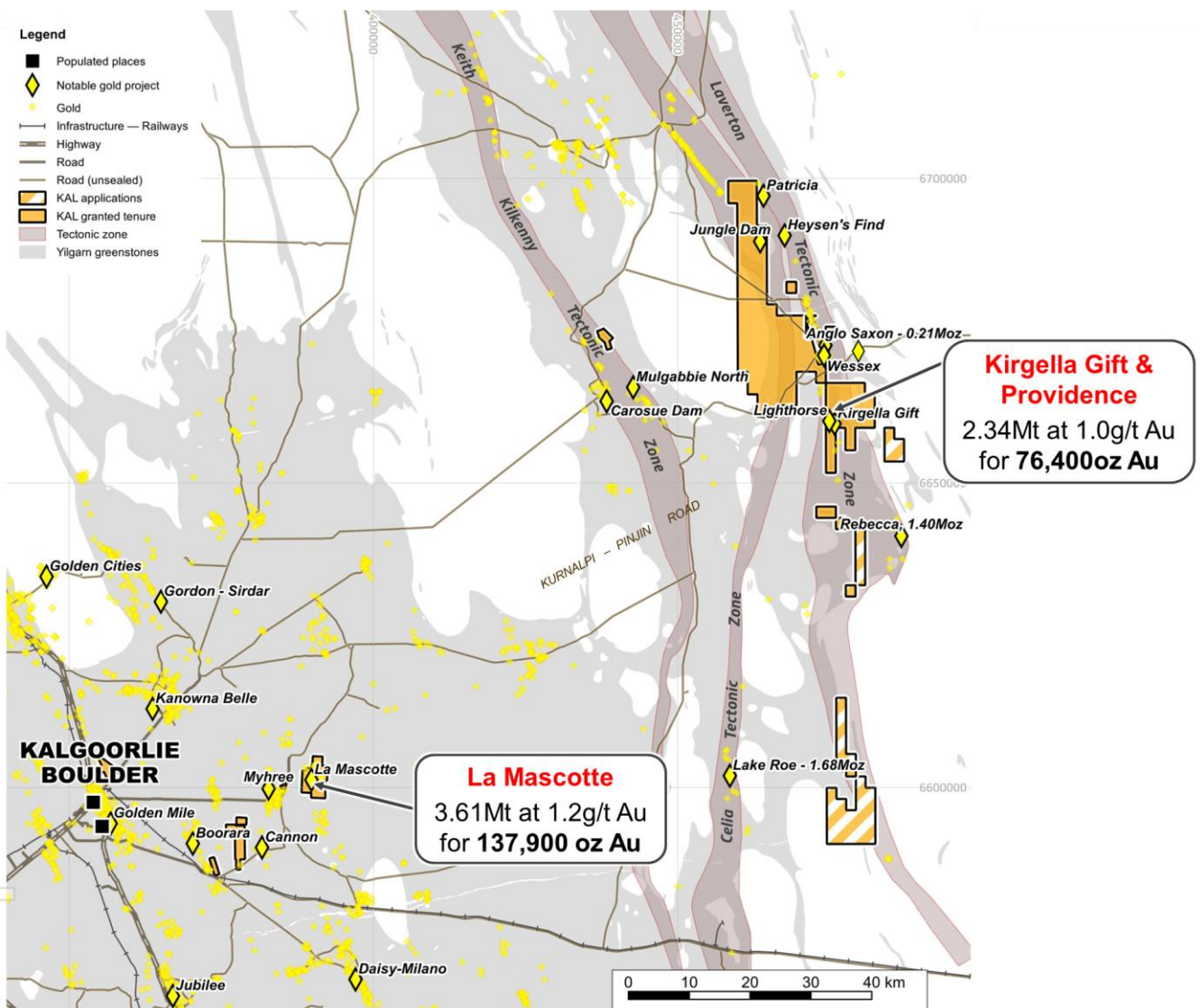


Figure 5 – Location map of the Kirgella Gift-Providence gold deposit and the Lighthorse prospect within KalGold's Pinjin Project, located around 140 km northeast of Kalgoorlie-Boulder. The project is situated approximately 25 km north of Ramelius Resources' (ASX: RMS) Rebecca Gold Project. Also shown is KalGold's outcropping La Mascotte gold deposit 35 km east of Kalgoorlie. Projection: MGA 94 Zone 51.

- The **Pinjin Project** within the **30 Moz Laverton Tectonic Zone** (host to Sunrise Dam, Granny Smith, Rebecca, Anglo Saxon, and Wallaby projects) is located only 25 km north along strike from Ramelius Resources (ASX: RMS) **Rebecca Gold Project**. A first JORC Code (2012) Inferred Mineral Resource Estimate at Kirgella Gift and Providence (2.34 Mt @ 1.0 g/t Au for 76,400 oz¹) represents the first area targeted at Pinjin, with many more targets scheduled for testing. The company aims to define further resources as these targets are tested. Some tenure is the subject of a farm-in over two years. Between this tenure and KalGold's own tenure and applications, the Company has established a significant presence in a strategic and important gold producing region.
- The **Bulong Taurus Project**, 35 km east of Kalgoorlie-Boulder. Contains the outcropping **La Mascotte** gold deposit where KalGold has defined a JORC Code (2012) Inferred Mineral Resource Estimate of 3.61 Mt @ 1.19 g/t Au for 138,000 oz², plus a series of satellite prospects and historic workings of the **Taurus Goldfield**. Work continues at the project.
- The **Central Yandal Gold Project**, 45 km east of Wiluna is in the heart of the prolific Yandal Greenstone Belt that is home to some of the world's greatest gold discoveries since the 1990s. Some tenure remains in application and assessment is ongoing.
