June 2026 - Quarter Activities Report

During the quarter, Black Horse Mining Ltd (Black Horse or the Company) received the final assay results from its maiden drilling programme at the Mt Egerton Gold Project, mobilised and temporarily demobilised a drill rig to site, and secured the necessary permit to re-establish the Sister Rose Adit.¹

MT EGERTON PROJECT

Final assay results for the four remaining holes (25MEDD002, 25MEDD002A, 25MEDD003, and 26MEDS001), were received completing the maiden drilling programme.¹

The Company commenced work on the re-establishment of the Sister Rose Adit during the quarter and is progressing well.²

CORPORATE

Subsequent to the quarter, Ms Amber Rivamonte resigned as Chief Financial Officer due to family commitments.

Cash balance and Related Party Payments

At the end of the quarter, the Company had a cash balance of \$5.23 million.
