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Acusensus Awarded Statewide Work Zone Enforcement Program in Kentucky USA

Highlights

- Acusensus has been awarded a Master Agreement by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet to supply statewide real-time speed enforcement services for highway work zones in Kentucky, USA
- The Agreement will run until 31 July 2028, and up to 31 July 2031 if all option periods are exercised
- An initial order of approximately US\$2.1m over one year is expected to be placed under the Agreement; the total contract value could reach up to US\$20 million should all options to expand the fleet and extend the term be exercised
- As is standard, revenue comes from a fixed monthly fee per trailer and is not linked to citation volumes

Acusensus Limited (ASX:ACE) (Acusensus or the Company) is pleased to announce that it has been awarded a Master Agreement by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) to supply a statewide real-time speed enforcement program at highway work zones (Agreement). The program is enabled by the Jared Lee Helton Act of 2025 (see KRS 189.2326), which authorises automated speed enforcement cameras in Kentucky at work zones where a worker is present.

Under the Agreement, KYTC can place orders for enforcement camera services which would see Acusensus supply, deploy, operate and maintain a fleet of camera trailers. The camera trailers can operate in both enforcement and data-collection modes, relaying violations to a downstream peace officer in real time. Acusensus retains ownership of the camera assets and is responsible for deploying and maintaining those assets.

The initial term of the Agreement runs from 1 August 2026 to 31 July 2028 and may be extended for three further one-year periods, to 31 July 2031. An initial order of approximately US\$2.1m is expected to be placed by KYTC, which would see Acusensus supplying a fleet of trailers for the first year of operation. Some of the assets required for such a fleet are already available in Kentucky, with the balance due progressively before the start of 2Q FY27.

Should KYTC exercise its options in the Agreement to expand the fleet and extend the term, the total contract value could reach up to US\$20 million. The Contract includes

commercial protections for Acusensus in the event of early termination for convenience by KYTC.

This Agreement has been awarded through a competitive tender process which commenced earlier in 2026. Acusensus has operated a pilot program in Kentucky since September 2025. The work zone enforcement method follows the model demonstrated by Arkansas, a program which also utilises Acusensus technology and services. The workzone speed enforcement program in Arkansas was expanded in early 2026 to also enforce mobile phone use and seatbelt compliance.

Acusensus Founder and Managing Director, Alexander Jannink, said:

"I am very pleased to be expanding our relationship with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet with this ongoing, state-wide program to protect road workers in Kentucky's highway work zones.

The Jared Lee Helton Act is one of a growing number of US state-level initiatives to keep roadworkers and road users safe in high risk areas of the road network. We are proud to support these initiatives with our unique enforcement solutions.

Kentucky is one of three concurrent state-wide work zone programs Acusensus supplies in the United States, alongside Connecticut and Arkansas. These programs provide a recurring revenue base and a proven delivery model which we can replicate as further states legislate.

I look forward to continuing our strong relationship with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet as we expand the program across the Commonwealth"
