3. Chairman's Letter

Dear Shareholder,

The Board is pleased to offer all Eligible Shareholders the opportunity to acquire two (2) New Shares for every three (3) Shares held as at the Record Date at an issue price of \$0.005 per New Share, together with one (1) Attaching Option for every two (2) New Shares issued for no additional consideration, with no minimum subscription (**Offer**). The Attaching Options have an exercise price of \$0.01 and are exercisable at any time prior to 5:00pm (Sydney time) on 30 November 2028.

If fully subscribed, the Offer will raise approximately \$1,487,056 (before expenses).

Eligible Shareholders are also entitled to subscribe for any New Shares and Attaching Options that are not subscribed for by other Eligible Shareholders in accordance with the Offer (**Shareholder Shortfall Offer**). Any New Shares not taken up under the Shareholder Shortfall Offer may be offered to investors who are not Eligible Shareholders under the Public Shortfall Offer.

In parallel with the Offer, Altitude Minerals has announced a private placement to sophisticated and professional investors to raise up to approximately \$334,587 (before expenses) (**Initial Placement**). 66,917,561 Shares will be issued in accordance with the Initial Placement, at an issue price of \$0.005 per Share, being the same issue price as the New Shares offered pursuant to the Offer.

A further 176,082,439 Shares (243,000,000 Shares in total under the Placement) and approximately 121,500,001 Attaching Options are also proposed to be issued on the same terms as the Offer subject to Shareholder approval, to raise a further \$880,412 (\$1,215,000 in total), which approval will be sought at a meeting of shareholders to be convened in the coming weeks.

The funds raised (after expenses) pursuant to the Offer and the Placement (together, the **Capital Raising**) (after expenses) are intended to be used to fund:

- (a) Drilling at the Firenze & Winnemucca Projects, Nevada;
- (b) business development; and
- (c) working capital purposes.

As the Offer is non-renounceable, your Entitlements will not be tradeable on the ASX or otherwise transferable. Eligible Shareholders who do not take up their Entitlements in full will not receive any value for those Entitlements that they do not take up.

4. Investment Overview

4.1 The Offer

The Offer is being undertaken as a non-renounceable entitlement offer of two (2) New Shares for every three (3) Shares held by Eligible Shareholders registered as at the Record Date, at an issue price of \$0.005 per New Share, together with one (1) Attaching Option for every two (2) New Shares issued (for nil additional consideration) (**Offer**). The Attaching Options have an exercise price of \$0.01 and are exercisable at any time prior to 5:00pm (Sydney time) on 30 November 2028.

Eligible Shareholders who wish to accept the Offer may do so in accordance with the instructions in section 6.1 on page 26 of this Prospectus.

Eligible Shareholders will receive a personalised Application Form setting out their Entitlement which will accompany a copy of this Prospectus.

Fractional entitlements to Shares will be rounded up to the nearest whole number and fractional entitlements to Attaching Options will be rounded up to the nearest whole number.

The Offer is non-renounceable. Accordingly, Entitlements do not trade on the ASX nor can they be sold, transferred or otherwise disposed of.

New Shares issued under the Offer are to be issued at the same price as the Shares issued under the Initial Placement.

All of the New Shares issued in accordance with this Prospectus will rank equally with the existing Shares on issue as at the date of this Prospectus.

Further detail regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to Shares are contained in section 7 on page 31 of this Prospectus. Further details regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Attaching Options are contained in section 8 on page 32 of this Prospectus.

Based on the capital structure of Altitude Minerals as at the date of this Prospectus and assuming that the Offer is fully subscribed, a maximum of 297,411,385 Shares may be issued pursuant to this Prospectus to raise up to a maximum of approximately \$1,487,056 (excluding expenses).

The intended use of the funds to be raised is set out in section 4.5 on page 9 of this Prospectus.

There is no minimum subscription amount in respect of the Offer, Shareholder Shortfall Offer or Public Shortfall Offer.

4.2 Shareholder Shortfall Offer

In addition to the Offer, Eligible Shareholders may apply to receive any New Shares not subscribed for pursuant to the Offer by participating in the Shareholder Shortfall Offer.

The issue price for Shortfall Shares offered under the Shareholder Shortfall Offer is the same as the Offer, being \$0.005, and successful Applicants will also receive one (1) Attaching Option for every two (2) Shortfall Shares issued (for nil additional consideration). The Attaching Options have an exercise price of \$0.01 and are exercisable at any time prior to 5:00pm (Sydney time) on 30 November 2028.

Eligible Shareholders who wish to apply for Shortfall Shares can do so in accordance with the instructions contained in section 6.2 on page 27 of this Prospectus.

Shares will only be offered under the Shareholder Shortfall Offer if the Offer is undersubscribed and will only be issued to the extent necessary to make up any shortfall in subscriptions received under the Offer.

Fractional Entitlements to Attaching Options under the Shareholder Shortfall Offer will be rounded up to the nearest whole number.

It is possible that, depending on the extent to which Eligible Shareholders participate in the Entitlement Offer or Shareholder Shortfall Offer, one or more Eligible Shareholders could increase their Shareholding significantly by participating in the Entitlement Offer or Shareholder Shortfall Offer.

The control effect of the Entitlement Offer and Shareholder Shortfall Offer is set out in section 4.10 of this Prospectus.

4.3 Public Shortfall Offer

The Directors reserve the right to offer and place the shortfall of any Shares not subscribed for pursuant to the Offer or Shareholder Shortfall Offer, at their discretion, together with one (1) Attaching Option for every two (2) Shares placed (for nil additional consideration), at any time within three (3) months of the Closing Date, which Shares will, in no circumstances, be issued at an issue price of less than \$0.005 (**Public Shortfall Offer**).

Any investors who are not currently Eligible Shareholders wishing to participate in the Public Shortfall Offer must submit an Application Form accompanying a copy of this Prospectus as given to them by or on behalf of Altitude Minerals and follow the instructions given to them by or on behalf of Altitude Minerals. The Directors retain their discretion to refuse to accept applications under the Public Shortfall Offer (in whole or in part).

The Public Shortfall Offer, which is a separate offer to the Offer and Shareholder Shortfall Offer, is made under this Prospectus and will remain open for up to three months from the Closing Date. The Shares and Attaching Options issued in accordance with the Public Shortfall Offer will rank equally with the New Shares and Attaching Options issued pursuant to the Offer and Shareholder Shortfall Offer, the terms of which are summarised in sections 7 and 8 of this Prospectus.

The Directors reserve the right to pay a commission of up to 6% (exclusive of GST) of any amounts subscribed under the Public Shortfall Offer through any licensed securities dealers or Australian financial services licensee in respect of any Applications lodged and accepted by Altitude Minerals.

4.4 Placement

The Offer has been supplemented by the Placement that was announced to the ASX on 17 September 2026, which is intended to raise up to approximately \$1,215,000 (before expenses), at an issue price of \$0.005 per Share, being the same issue price as the Shares offered pursuant to the Offer.

The Shares issued in accordance with the Placement will rank equally with existing Shares, and participants under the Placement will not be eligible to participate in the Offer.

Participants in the Placement will also receive one (1) unquoted Option for every two (2) Shares subscribed for, having an exercise price of \$0.01 and are exercisable at any time prior to 5:00pm (Sydney time) on 30 November 2028.

4.5 Purpose of the Offer

The purpose of the Offer is to raise up to approximately \$1,487,056.

This has been supplemented by the Initial Placement, which is expected to raise approximately \$334,587 (before expenses) and the Conditional Placement, which is expected to raise a further \$880,412 (before expenses), subject to Altitude Minerals obtaining Shareholder approval.

Depending on how much money is raised through the Offer, the funds raised under the Capital Raising (after expenses) of approximately \$2.6 million will be applied to:

The above is a statement of current intentions as at the date of this Prospectus. As with any budget, intervening events (including additional requirements arising from exploration and other activities) and new circumstances have the potential to affect the manner in which the funds are ultimately applied, which the Board reserves the right to do.

Please refer to section 4.11 on page 12 of this Prospectus for further details relating to the estimated expenses of the Offer.

The Directors intend to place the shortfall of any Shares not subscribed for pursuant to the Offer, within three months following the Closing Date, and to carry out additional capital raising activities if necessary.

4.6 Principal effect of the Offer

The principal effect of the Offer, assuming that the Offer is fully subscribed and that no Options are exercised prior to the Record Date, will be to:

- (a) increase Altitude Minerals' cash position by up to \$1,487,056 (before the expenses of the Offer) immediately after completion of the Offer; and
- (b) increase the expected number of Shares on issue post Initial Placement, from 446,117,078 to 810,446,024 Shares.

4.7 Effect on capital structure

The effect of the Offer on Altitude Minerals' capital structure, assuming that the Offer is fully subscribed and that no Options are exercised prior to the Record Date, is set out below:

As the lowest exercise price of the unquoted options is approximately 680% higher than the Share price as at the last trading day prior to the announcement of the Offer, the Board does not anticipate that any of the Options will be exercised prior to the Record Date for the Offer and, therefore, the Options are not likely to give rise to any impact on the control of Altitude Minerals.

A further 148,705,693 Shares may also be issued in the event that the Offer is fully subscribed and all of the Attaching Options are subsequently exercised. If all Attaching Options are exercised, Altitude Minerals will also receive approximately \$1,487,056 on the exercise of the Attaching Options.

4.8 Dilution of Eligible Shareholders that do not accept their Entitlement

As the Offer is an offer of two (2) New Shares for every three (3) Shares held by Eligible Shareholders, the maximum dilution that will be experienced by any Eligible Shareholder that fails to subscribe for any Entitlement is approximately 40% of its existing Shareholding.

Eligible Shareholders should note that if they do not accept their Entitlements in full, their Shareholdings are likely to be diluted as follows:

As at the date of this Prospectus, Altitude Minerals has not received any binding commitment from any of the above Shareholders as to whether they intend to subscribe for their respective Entitlements under the Offer or participate in the Shareholder Shortfall Offer.

If the Offer is fully subscribed and the Macallum Parties and BNP subscribe for all of their Entitlements under the Offer, there will be no change to the Macallum Parties' and BNP's relevant interests in Altitude Minerals' Shares.

If the parties set out above do not fully participate in the Offer, their relevant interest in Altitude Minerals' Shares may reduce depending on the extent to which other Eligible Shareholders participate in the Offer and Shareholder Shortfall Offer.

Similarly, if the Macallum Parties and BNP subscribe for all of their Entitlements under the Offer, but the Offer is not fully subscribed, the Macallum Parties and BNP may increase their relevant interest in Altitude Minerals. The extent to which the Macallum Parties and BNP relevant interest in Altitude Minerals' Shares may increase is dependent upon the level that other Shareholders subscribe for their full Entitlement or not.

4.10 Potential effect on control

As the acquisition of New Shares under the Offer and Shareholder Shortfall Offer do not satisfy the requirements of exception 10 of section 611 of the Corporations Act, no person shall be entitled to acquire New Shares pursuant to the Offer or Shareholder Shortfall Offer if to do so would result in their or another person's Voting Power increasing from 20% or below to more than 20%, or from a starting point above 20% to below 90%, unless a separate exception to the restrictions contained in section 606 of the Corporations Act applies.

As there are no known exceptions that will apply, applications for New Shares will be rejected (in whole or in part) where the effect of issuing New Shares to the Applicant will result in the Applicant's, or another person's, Voting Power in Altitude Minerals increasing from 20% or below to more than 20%, or from a starting point above 20% to below 90%.

4.11 Expenses of the Offer

As noted elsewhere, the Initial Placement has been supplemented by the proposed Conditional Placement that requires Shareholder approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and Listing Rule 10.11.

Accordingly, this Prospectus includes a separate Placement Option Offer of Attaching Options on the terms set out in section 8 on page 32 of this Prospectus. No application monies are payable pursuant to the Placement Option Offer.

Only participants in the Placement may accept the Placement Option Offer. The relevant Application Form will be issued to participants in the Placement by Altitude Minerals together with a copy of this Prospectus.

4.13 Broker Option Offer

Altitude Minerals has agreed to offer Options to the Lead Manager, GBA Capital Pty Ltd (or its nominees), for capital raising services provided to Altitude Minerals.

This Prospectus includes a separate Broker Option Offer of one (1) Option for every five (5) New Shares issued under the Placement (to non-Director investors), exercisable at \$0.01 each and exercisable prior to 5:00pm (Sydney time) on 30 November 2028 on the terms set out in section 4.15 on page 14 of this Prospectus. No application monies are payable pursuant to the Broker Option Offer.

Only the Lead Manager (or its nominees) may accept the Broker Option Offer. The relevant Application Form will be issued to the Lead Manager (or its nominees) together with a copy of this Prospectus.

4.14 Overseas shareholders

The offer of New Shares and Attaching Options pursuant to this Prospectus does not, and is not intended to, constitute an offer or invitation in any place or jurisdiction in which, or to any person to whom, it would be unlawful to make such an offer or to issue this Prospectus.

It is not reasonable for Altitude Minerals to comply with the securities laws of all overseas jurisdictions in which Shareholders are resident having regard to the number of overseas Shareholders and the number and value of Shares these Shareholders would be offered and the cost of complying with the regulatory requirements in each relevant jurisdiction.

The Offer and Shareholder Shortfall Offer is not being extended to Shareholders that are recorded in Altitude Minerals' share register as having an address that is outside Australia or New Zealand.

Where the Public Shortfall Offer is extended to non-Shareholders, it will only be extended to persons who are Australian residents and other persons to whom the Board is satisfied, in its sole discretion, that it would not be unlawful to offer Shares or Attaching Options to, with or without any such conditions as the Board sees fit (in its sole discretion), based on the local laws of the country in which an applicant may reside.

This Prospectus is prepared under Australian law and is not a product disclosure statement prepared under New Zealand law. New Zealand law normally requires people who offer financial products to give information to investors before they invest. This requires those offering financial products to have disclosed information that is important for investors to make an informed decision.

No New Zealand product disclosure statement is being prepared and the offer of New Shares and Attaching Options is being extended to Eligible Shareholders that were recorded in Altitude Minerals' share register as having an address in New Zealand as a 'small offer' under the *Financial Markets Conduct Act* (New Zealand).

As a result, Eligible Shareholders that were recorded in Altitude Minerals' share register as having an address in New Zealand may not be given all the information usually required under New Zealand law and will also have fewer other legal protections for this investment.

The taxation treatment of Australian financial products is not the same as for New Zealand financial products.

If you are uncertain about whether this investment is appropriate for you, you should seek the advice of an appropriately qualified financial adviser.

The Offer may involve a currency exchange risk. The currency for the financial products is not New Zealand dollars. The value of the financial products will go up or down according to changes in the exchange rate between that currency and New Zealand dollars. These changes may be significant.

Any amounts paid on the financial products will be in Australian dollars and not New Zealand dollars. You may incur significant fees in having any such Australian dollar funds credited to a bank account in New Zealand in New Zealand dollars.

If the financial products are able to be traded on a financial product market and you wish to trade the financial products through that market, you will have to make arrangements for a participant in that market to sell the financial products on your behalf. The financial products are not currently traded on any financial product market in New Zealand. The way in which

any financial product trading market operates, the regulation of participants in that market, and the information available to you about the financial products and trading may differ from the financial product trading markets that operate in New Zealand.

Eligible Shareholders that are resident in Australia or New Zealand that hold Shares on behalf of persons who are resident in jurisdictions other than Australia and New Zealand are responsible for ensuring that taking up any Entitlement pursuant to the Offer does not breach regulations in the relevant overseas jurisdiction. The return of a duly completed Application will be taken by Altitude Minerals to constitute a representation that there has been no breach of those regulations.

Furthermore, the offer of New Shares and Attaching Options pursuant to the Offer, Shareholder Shortfall Offer and Public Shortfall Offer is only being extended to persons who are Australian and New Zealand residents and other persons to whom the Board (in consultation with the Lead Manager) is satisfied, in its sole discretion, that it would not be unlawful (with or without such conditions as the Board sees fit) based on the local laws of the country in which an Applicant may reside to offer New Shares or Attaching Options.

4.15 Lead Manager Engagement

Altitude Minerals and the Lead Manager are party to a letter of engagement pursuant to which the Lead Manager has agreed to lead manage the Capital Raising (**Mandate**).

Pursuant to the Mandate, Altitude Minerals has appointed the Lead Manager as the lead manager to the Capital Raising to (among other things):

- (a) act as lead manager and sole bookrunner to Altitude Minerals in connection with the Capital Raising;
- (b) market the Capital Raising and assist in the drafting of any documentation in connection with the Capital Raising;
- (c) advise on the structuring and timing of the Capital Raising and assist with dealings with regulatory bodies (including ASX and ASIC) in relation to the Capital Raising; and
- (d) provide Altitude Minerals with such other assistance in undertaking the Capital Raising as is customary and appropriate for a lead manager in this type of transaction.

Altitude Minerals must pay the Lead Manager:

- (a) a capital raising fee of 6% (plus GST) of the amount of all gross proceeds pursuant to the Placement (excluding the Directors' participation);
- (b) a capital raising fee equal to 6% (plus GST) of all gross proceeds pursuant to the Public Shortfall Offer (payable in addition to the fee in paragraph (a) immediately above; and
- (c) one (1) option for every five (5) Shares issued under the Placement on the same terms as the Attaching Options issued under the Offer (**Broker Options**).

Altitude Minerals has agreed to pay or reimburse the Lead Manager for its reasonable out-of-pocket expenses (plus GST) incurred in connection with this Prospectus and the Capital Raising, whether or not the Capital Raising proceeds.

Subject to certain exclusions relating to fraud, recklessness, wilful misconduct or gross negligence, Altitude Minerals indemnifies the Lead Manager and certain affiliated parties, on an after-tax basis, against certain liabilities and losses incurred or sustained directly or indirectly in connection with the Capital Raising.

The Mandate may be terminated immediately by the Lead Manager if Altitude Minerals breaches the Mandate, and where the breach is capable of remedy, fails to remedy it within 10 Business Days of written notice.

Altitude Minerals may terminate the Mandate for:

- (a) cause (gross negligence, wilful misconduct, recklessness, fraud or material breach of the Mandate by the Lead Manager) provided Altitude Minerals gives reasonable details of the relevant conduct and, where capable of remedy, 10 Business Days' to remedy before termination takes effect; or
- (b) convenience on 30 days' written notice provided that no such notice may be given during the initial term of the Mandate.

The Mandate grants a first right of refusal to the Lead Manager to act as lead manager for any future capital raisings by Altitude Minerals from the date of the Mandate until 6 months after the later of completion of the Capital Raising or the date of termination of the Mandate.

The Mandate contains various representations, warranties, indemnities and undertakings in favour of the Lead Manager that are usual for an arrangement of this sort. In particular, the Mandate contains various representations and warranties by Altitude Minerals relating to Altitude Minerals and its disclosure of information to the Lead Manager and compliance with procedures and regulations.

5. Risks

5.1 Introduction

The New Shares and Attaching Options offered in accordance with this Prospectus are considered highly speculative. An investment in Altitude Minerals is not risk free and the Directors strongly recommend that potential investors consider the risk factors described below, together with information contained elsewhere in this Prospectus and otherwise disclosed to the ASX, and consult their professional advisers before deciding whether to apply for New Shares or Attaching Options pursuant to this Prospectus.

In addition to the specific risks that relate directly to Altitude Minerals, there are also other general risks, many of which are largely beyond the control of Altitude Minerals and the Directors, that investors should consider. The risks identified in this section, or other risk factors, may have a material impact on the financial performance of Altitude Minerals and the market price of any New Shares and/or Attaching Options issued pursuant to this Prospectus.

5.2 Company specific

(a) Key sensitivities of Altitude Minerals' projects

The future success of Altitude Minerals is primarily dependent on the success of the mineral exploration activities carried out on Altitude Minerals' existing or future projects. The projects located in the USA, South Australia, New South Wales and other jurisdictions as appropriate, together with any other project that Altitude Minerals may in the future acquire, are subject to the following key sensitivities:

- (1) the identification and exploration of a mineral deposit with sufficient potential to be economically and commercially viable;
- (2) the delineation of sufficient Mineral Resources and Ore Reserves so as to result in the viable extraction and processing of base metals (copper, lead and zinc) and/or precious metals (gold and silver) from those projects;
- (3) metal commodity prices and, in particular, those of base metals (copper, lead and zinc) and/or precious metals (gold and silver);
- (4) processing costs of base metals (copper, lead and zinc) and/or precious metals (gold and silver); and
- (5) the capital cost to construct any required processing plant and associated facilities or the cost of transporting any extracted materials to a third party's processing facility.

There is also no guarantee that Altitude Minerals will be able to obtain all the necessary approvals, permits, licences or consents required to develop the projects or any other project that it may, in the future, acquire.

(b) Current funding risk

The Offer is not underwritten and it is highly unlikely that the Offer will be fully subscribed.

The Directors have tried to mitigate this risk by offering Shortfall Shares for sale in accordance with the Shareholder Shortfall Offer, but there can be no guarantee that any or all of the Shortfall Shares will be subscribed for.

Accordingly, it is likely that the proceeds of the Offer will be less than the maximum amount sought, being \$1,487,056, and Altitude Minerals will need to consider alternative methods to raise additional capital, such as undertaking further placements of Shares.

However, there is no certainty that Altitude Minerals will be able to raise additional capital, or that it will be able to do so on favourable terms.

If Altitude Minerals is able to raise additional capital, it may be required to do so at a significant discount to the issue price of the New Shares in accordance with the Offer. If this occurs, this may significantly dilute existing Shareholders.

If Altitude Minerals cannot raise additional capital through the issue of additional Shares, it may be forced to dispose of some or all of its interest in one of more of its assets. If Altitude Minerals is required to dispose of assets in those circumstances to a third party, it is likely that such disposal will not be on favourable terms, including price.

If Altitude Minerals is not able to raise additional funding in a timely manner through either the issue of additional Shares or the disposal of assets, it could have a significant detrimental effect on the financial position and viability of Altitude Minerals.

(c) Operational and exploration risk

The business of mineral exploration, development and production, by its nature, involves significant risks. The tenements of Altitude Minerals are at various stages of exploration, and potential investors should understand that mineral exploration and development are high-risk undertakings. There can be no assurance that exploration of Altitude Minerals' current tenements, or any other tenements that may be acquired in the future, will result in the discovery of an economic ore deposit. Even if an apparently viable deposit is identified, there is no guarantee that it can be economically exploited.

The business depends on, amongst other things, successful exploration and identification of mineral reserves, geological conditions, security of tenure, the availability of adequate funding, satisfactory performance of mining operations, limitations on activities due to inclement weather or seasonal weather patterns, availability and cost of consumables and plant and equipment (including drilling rigs and other necessary machinery to undertake exploration, development and production) and skilled labour when required, industrial and environmental accidents, native title process, changing government regulations and many other factors beyond the control of Altitude Minerals.

(d) Grant and renewal of permits

Altitude Minerals' mineral exploration activities are dependent upon the granting and maintenance (including renewal) of its current tenements or other tenements in which Altitude Minerals acquires an interest.

Maintenance of Altitude Minerals' tenements is dependent on, among other things, its ability to meet the licence conditions imposed by relevant authorities including minimum annual expenditure requirements which, in turn, is dependent on it being sufficiently funded to meet those expenditure requirements.

(e) Foreign exchange rate risk

The Company's revenue and expenditure are and will be taken into account in Australian dollars. A significant proportion of Altitude Minerals operating and exploration expenses have been incurred in Nevada, USA. Copper and Gold is sold throughout the world based principally on a US dollar price. Therefore, Altitude Minerals is exposed to fluctuations and volatility in the USD/AUD exchange rates. Movements in these exchange rates may adversely or beneficially affect Altitude Minerals results or the ability of Altitude Minerals to raise further funds (in AUD) to advance its operations (in USD).

5.3 Industry specific risk

There are a number of industry specific risks associated with Altitude Minerals which have a reasonable likelihood of occurring, are difficult to mitigate, and if they do eventuate, would have a significant effect on Altitude Minerals' financial position, prospects or the price of its Shares and are, therefore, key risks. These risks include:

(a) Future funding requirements

Altitude Minerals' capital requirements depend on numerous factors, including the success of its planned exploration programs, the future exploration programs for its projects, Altitude Minerals' ability to generate income from its operations and possible acquisitions or other corporate opportunities. Altitude Minerals may require further capital to achieve its objective of transitioning from explorer to producer. If Altitude Minerals acquires any new project, it may need to raise further capital to fund the acquisition or the project once acquired.

For the foreseeable future, it is expected that this funding will be obtained from equity financing. Any equity financing undertaken will dilute existing Shareholders.

There is no guarantee that Altitude Minerals will be able to secure any additional funding or be able to secure funding on terms that are favourable or acceptable to Altitude Minerals.

This may require that Altitude Minerals reduce the scope of its operations or, if necessary, surrender or dispose of some of its interest in one or more of its assets to a third party.

There is a risk that Altitude Minerals will not be able to meet the work commitments or satisfy the required licence fees, which may result in one or more of its tenements being forfeited.

Similarly, while debt financing is unlikely to be available to Altitude Minerals for the foreseeable future, any debt financing, if available, may involve restrictions on financing and operating activities.

(b) Commodity price fluctuations

It is anticipated that any future revenues derived from mining will primarily be derived from the sale of minerals. Consequently, any future earnings are likely to be closely related to the price of base metals (copper, lead and zinc) and/or precious metals (gold and silver), gold and other mined commodities. Consequently, any future earnings are likely to be closely related to the price of these metals.

The prices of minerals are influenced by numerous variable factors beyond the control of Altitude Minerals, including laws and regulations, economic conditions and trading demand and supply. Fluctuations in mineral prices may, positively or negatively, influence the operating and financial performance of projects and businesses in which Altitude Minerals has an interest or proposes to have an interest.

Even if this is not the case, general sentiment towards one or more minerals may have a significant adverse affect on the price of Shares.

(c) Land access

Altitude Minerals will be required to negotiate access arrangements and pay compensation to land owners, local authorities, traditional land users and others who may have an interest in the area covered by its tenements. Altitude Minerals' ability to resolve access and compensation issues will have an impact on the future success and financial performance of Altitude Minerals' operations.

The effect of present laws in respect of native title that apply in Australia is that mining tenements (including applications for mining tenements) may be affected by native title claims or procedures, which may prevent or delay the granting of tenements, or affect the ability of Altitude Minerals to explore and develop its tenements.

In addition, where the relevant part of Altitude Minerals' tenements is not accessible without crossing land which is not owned by Altitude Minerals, Altitude Minerals may be required to obtain the consent of owners and occupiers of land within the tenements to carry out its planned activities on such land or otherwise pass through such land. Compensation may be required to be paid to the owners and occupiers of land in order for exploration and development activities to be carried out.

Negotiations with land owners, local authorities, traditional land users and others may therefore be required before Altitude Minerals can access land for exploration or mining activities. Inability to access, or delays experienced in accessing, the land may impact on Altitude Minerals' activities. Special conditions may also attach to exploration (if permitted) in special locations within Altitude Minerals' tenements, including those of environmental or heritage significance. There may be delays experienced in negotiating these conditions, and there is a risk that the parties cannot reach agreement and the matter could result in Altitude Minerals not being able to conduct the exploration or production activities on terms acceptable to Altitude Minerals (or at all).

Access is critical for exploration and development to succeed and the ability to be able to negotiate satisfactory commercial arrangements with land owners, local authorities, traditional land users and occupiers is often essential.

(d) Exploration costs

The exploration costs of Altitude Minerals are based on certain assumptions with respect to the method and timing of exploration. By their nature, these estimates and assumptions are subject to significant uncertainties and, accordingly, the actual costs may materially differ from these estimates and assumptions. Accordingly, no assurance can be given that the cost estimates and the underlying assumptions will be realised in practice, which may materially and adversely affect Altitude Minerals' viability.

(e) Mineral resource estimates

Altitude Minerals does not have any Mineral Resources or Ore Reserves and there is no certainty that it will ever have any such Mineral Resources or Ore Reserves.

However, mineral resource estimates are expressions of judgement and are estimates based on knowledge, experience and industry practice. While these estimates may be appropriate when made, they may change significantly when new information or techniques become available.

Estimates are a necessary practice and may change significantly or cease to be accurate when new information or techniques become available through additional fieldwork and analysis. Mineral resource estimates are, by their nature, imprecise and, to an extent, depend on interpretation, which may result in inaccuracies. Should Altitude Minerals encounter mineralisation or formations different from those predicted by past drilling, sampling and similar examinations, resource estimates may have to be adjusted and mining plans may have to be altered in a way which could adversely affect Altitude Minerals' operations. New information, practices or techniques may result in Altitude Minerals revising any initial estimates of its Mineral Resources or Ore Reserves, which may could adversely affect Altitude Minerals' operations.

(f) Native title risk

Access to land for exploration purposes can be adversely affected by land ownership, including private (freehold) land, pastoral lease and native title land or claims under the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth) (**NTA**) (or similar legislation in the jurisdiction where Altitude Minerals operates). The effect of the NTA is that existing and new tenements held by Altitude Minerals may be affected by native title claims and procedures.

There is a risk that a determination could be made that native title exists in relation to land the subject of a tenement held or to be held by Altitude Minerals which may affect the operation of Altitude Minerals' business and development activities. In the event that it is determined that native title does exist or a native title claim has been registered, Altitude Minerals may need to comply with procedures under the NTA in order to carry out its operations or to be granted any additional rights required. Such procedures may take considerable time, involve the negotiation of significant agreements, may involve access rights, and require the payment of compensation to those persons holding or claiming native title in the land the subject of a tenement held or to be held by Altitude Minerals. The involvement in the administration and determination of native title issues may have a material adverse impact on the position of Altitude Minerals in terms of cash flows, financial performance, business development, and the Share price.

(g) Environmental risks

The operations and proposed activities of Altitude Minerals are subject to both Australian and United States' Federal and State laws and regulations concerning the environment. All exploration projects and mining operations have an impact on the environment, particularly advanced exploration and mine development.

The Company endeavours to conduct its activities to the highest standard of environmental obligation, including compliance with all environmental laws. However, as with all exploration and mining activities, Altitude Minerals' operations are expected to have an impact on the environment. There are also risks inherent in Altitude Minerals' activities including accidental leakages, spills, or other unforeseen circumstances that could subject Altitude Minerals to extensive liability.

Further, Altitude Minerals may require approval from the relevant authorities before undertaking activities that are likely to impact on the environment. If Altitude Minerals fails to obtain such approvals it will be prevented from undertaking those activities. The Company cannot predict what future legislation and regulations may govern mining, and may impose significant environmental obligations on Altitude Minerals.

(h) Metallurgy

Metal and/or mineral recoveries are dependent upon metallurgical processes and, by their nature, contain elements of significant risk such as:

- (1) identifying a metallurgical process through test work to produce a saleable metal and/or concentrate;
- (2) developing an economic process route to produce a metal and/or concentrate; and
- (3) changes in the mineralogy of the ore deposit can result in inconsistent metal recovery, affecting the economic viability of Altitude Minerals' projects.

(i) Competition risk

The industry in which Altitude Minerals will be involved is subject to domestic and global competition. Although Altitude Minerals will undertake all reasonable due diligence in its business decisions and operations, Altitude Minerals will have no influence or control over the activities or actions of its competitors, which activities or actions may, positively or negatively, affect the operating and financial performance of Altitude Minerals' projects and business.

In particular, Altitude Minerals' ability to undertake exploration and mining activities is dependent upon its ability to source and acquire appropriate mining equipment and personnel. Equipment and personnel are not always readily available and the market for mining equipment and personnel experiences fluctuations in supply and demand. Increases in worldwide mining activities may create cost pressures for services and skilled personnel in the resources industry, which may affect the ability to purchase or hire equipment, supplies, and services and to recruit skilled personnel in relation to the projects. In addition, the availability of drilling rigs and other equipment and services is affected by the level and location of drilling activity around the world. An increase in drilling activity in Australia may reduce the availability of equipment and services to Altitude Minerals. In addition, an increased demand for mineral

commodities may significantly increase the demand for many mining and processing inputs, which has resulted in shortages, as well as longer lead times for delivery and increases in pricing, of mining equipment and metallurgical plant, strategic spares and critical consumables. The reduced availability of equipment, services and skilled personnel may delay the planned exploration, development, and production activities at the projects. A shortage of skilled labour in the Australian mining industry could result in Altitude Minerals having insufficient employees or contractors to operate its business, which could adversely affect Altitude Minerals' business, results of operations and financial condition.

(j) Regulatory risks and government policy changes

Altitude Minerals' exploration and development activities are subject to extensive laws and regulations relating to numerous matters including resource licence consents, conditions including environmental compliance and rehabilitation, taxation, employee relations, health and worker safety, waste disposal, protection of the environment, native title and heritage matters, protection of endangered and protected species and other matters. Changes in government policies or legislation may affect ownership of mineral interests, taxation, royalties, land access, labour relations, and mining and exploration activities of Altitude Minerals.

Altitude Minerals requires permits from regulatory authorities to authorise Altitude Minerals' operations. These permits relate to exploration, development, production, and rehabilitation activities. Obtaining necessary permits can be a time consuming process and there is a risk that Altitude Minerals may not obtain these permits on acceptable terms, in a timely manner or at all. Any costs or delays associated with obtaining necessary permits and complying with these permits and applicable laws and regulations could materially delay or restrict Altitude Minerals from proceeding with the development of a project or the operation or development of a mine. Any failure to comply with applicable laws and regulations or permits, even if inadvertent, could result in material fines, penalties or other liabilities. In extreme cases, failure could result in suspension of Altitude Minerals' activities or forfeiture of one or more of Altitude Minerals' tenements.

(k) Economic and market conditions

General economic conditions, movements in interest and inflation rates and currency exchange rates may have an adverse effect on Altitude Minerals' ability to fund its operations. Share market conditions may affect the value of Altitude Minerals' Shares regardless of Altitude Minerals' operating performance. Share market conditions are affected by many factors such as:

- (1) general economic outlook;
- (2) commodity prices;
- (3) interest rates and inflation rates;
- (4) changes in investor sentiment toward particular market sectors and commodity types;
- (5) the demand for, and supply of, capital; and
- (6) terrorism or other hostilities.

The market price of securities can fall as well as rise and may be subject to varied and unpredictable influences on the market for securities in general. Neither Altitude Minerals nor the Directors warrant the future performance of Altitude Minerals or any return on an investment in Altitude Minerals.

(l) Foreign exchange rate risk

Altitude Minerals' revenue and expenditure will be taken into account in Australian dollars. Most of Altitude Minerals' operating and exploration expenses are incurred in United States Dollars (**USD**). Copper, silver and gold is sold throughout the world based principally on a USD price. Therefore, Altitude Minerals is exposed to fluctuations and volatility in the USD and AUD exchange rates. Movements in these exchange rates may adversely or beneficially affect Altitude Minerals' results or operations and cash flows.

(m) Taxation

The acquisition and disposal of Shares will have tax consequences, which will differ depending on the individual financial affairs of each investor. All potential investors in Altitude Minerals are urged to obtain independent financial advice about the consequences of acquiring Shares from a taxation viewpoint and generally.

To the maximum extent permitted by law, Altitude Minerals, its officers and each of their respective advisors accept no liability and responsibility with respect to the taxation consequences of subscribing for Shares in accordance with this Prospectus.

(n) Reliance on key personnel

The Directors are primarily responsible for overseeing the operations and the strategic management of Altitude Minerals. The day-to-day operations of Altitude Minerals are the responsibility of the Managing Director.

There can be no assurance that there will be no detrimental impact on Altitude Minerals if one or more of the Directors, particularly the Managing Director, no longer act as Directors of Altitude Minerals.

(o) Liquidity risk

An application will be made to ASX for Quotation of the New Shares offered pursuant to this Prospectus within 7 days of the date of this Prospectus. Altitude Minerals will also apply for Quotation of any Shares issued on the exercise of the Attaching Options if still quoted by the ASX at that time.

However, no assurance can be given of the price at which New Shares will trade or that they will trade at all. Potential Applicants should, therefore, be prepared to hold their New Shares for extended periods pending the development of Altitude Minerals' Projects and potential opportunities emerging in the future. The market price of Equity Securities can fall, as well as rise, and may be subject to varied and unpredictable influences on the market for equities and, in particular, resources entities. Neither Altitude Minerals nor the Directors provide any warranty as to the future performance of Altitude Minerals or any return on an investment in Altitude Minerals.

This may affect the liquidity of trading in Altitude Minerals' Shares, which may result in a lower volume of Shares being traded than would otherwise have been the case, potentially making it difficult to realise any return on your investment.

(p) Information technology/privacy

Altitude Minerals relies heavily on its own computer systems and those of third party service providers to store and manage private and confidential information. A malicious attack on Altitude Minerals' systems, processes or people from external or internal sources could put the integrity and privacy of Altitude Minerals' data at risk. If Altitude Minerals' efforts to combat any malicious attack are unsuccessful or Altitude Minerals has actual or perceived vulnerabilities, not only could this result in Altitude Minerals suffering short term economic loss, but Altitude Minerals' business reputation and brand name may be harmed, potentially having a material adverse effect on Altitude Minerals' operations and financial position.

(q) Environment and climate change.

There are a number of climate-related factors that may affect the operations and proposed activities of Altitude Minerals.

Climate change may be said to cause certain physical and environmental risks that cannot be predicted by Altitude Minerals, including events such as increased severity of weather patterns and incidence of extreme weather events and longer-term physical risks such as shifting climate patterns. These risks said to be associated with climate change may have a direct impact on Altitude Minerals' ability to perform its mining operations, and may significantly change the industry in which Altitude Minerals operates.

In addition, changing investor sentiment towards climate change, including a view that all mining should be avoided due to its contribution to greenhouse gas emissions (despite the reliance on the various metals by the renewables sector) and, thus, cause investors to cease investing in mining and exploration entities, may have a significant adverse affect on Altitude Minerals' ability to secure additional funding and other ancillary products and services (including, for example, appropriate insurance at affordable prices).

(r) NGOs

Altitude Minerals' operations may be subject to opposition or scrutiny from non-governmental organisations (**NGOs**), community groups, and other stakeholders. NGO campaigns or advocacy efforts directed at Altitude Minerals, its operations, or the broader industry in which it operates may result in reputational harm, disruption to operations, delays in obtaining or maintaining necessary approvals and permits, or increased regulatory scrutiny.

Altitude Minerals may be required to engage with NGOs and other interest groups in negotiations regarding access, compensation, environmental conditions, or operational practices. The ability to resolve such engagements on terms acceptable to Altitude Minerals will have an impact on the future success and financial performance of its operations.

Where agreement cannot be reached, there is a risk that Altitude Minerals may be unable to conduct planned activities on acceptable terms, or at all. Access to and

continued operation across Altitude Minerals' tenements may be contingent on maintaining constructive relationships with a broad range of stakeholders. Inability to do so, or delays arising from disputes with NGOs or advocacy groups, may materially impact Altitude Minerals' activities, financial condition, and prospects.

5.4 Speculative investment

The above risk factors ought not to be taken as exhaustive of the risks faced by Altitude Minerals or by investors in Altitude Minerals. The above factors, and others not specifically referred to above, may in the future materially affect the financial performance of Altitude Minerals and the value of the New Shares and Attaching Options offered under this Prospectus.

Therefore, the New Shares and Attaching Options to be issued pursuant to this Prospectus carry no guarantee with respect to the payment of dividends, returns of capital or the market value of those Shares or Attaching Options.

Potential investors should consider that the investment in Altitude Minerals is speculative and should consult their professional advisers before deciding whether to apply for any New Shares and Attaching Options pursuant to this Prospectus.

6. Applications

7. Rights and liabilities attaching to Shares

Shares issued pursuant to this Prospectus will have the same rights and liabilities as Altitude Minerals' existing Shares on issue as at the date of this Prospectus. The full details of the rights attaching to Shares are set out in the Constitution, a copy of which is available on Altitude Minerals' ASX announcements which can be accessed on <https://altitudeminerals.com/> and may also be inspected at Altitude Minerals' registered office. A summary of the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares is set out below.

7.1 Voting rights

At a general meeting every Shareholder present in person by proxy, attorney or representative has one vote on a show of hands and every Shareholder present in person or by proxy, attorney or representative has one vote for each Share on a poll.

7.2 Dividends

Dividends are declared by the Directors at their discretion and are paid to Shareholders according to their rights and interest in the profits at the time of entitlement to the dividend. The Directors may determine that a dividend is payable on a Share and fix the dividend amount, franking, time for determining dividend entitlements, time for payment and method of payment.

7.3 Transfer of Shares

Generally, the Directors will not refuse to register a transfer unless the ASX Settlement Operating Rules or the ASX Listing Rules permit it to do so, or the transfer would result in a contravention of law, the transfer would result in more than three persons being registered as joint holders or Altitude Minerals has a lien on the Shares.

7.4 Future increases in capital

The allotment or issue of any Shares of Altitude Minerals is under the control of the Directors who may, subject to the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules, allot or otherwise dispose of them on any terms, at any time and for any consideration, as the Directors resolve.

7.5 Variation of rights

The rights and privileges attaching to Shares can be altered by a special resolution of Shareholders or the written consent of at least 75% of the Shareholders. A special resolution is a resolution passed by a majority of not less than 75% of those present and voting.

7.6 Rights on winding up

In the event of a winding up of Altitude Minerals:

- (a) any surplus will be divided among the Shareholders in the proportion that the amount paid up on the Shares bears to the total amount paid up on all Shares of Altitude Minerals on issue; and
- (b) surplus assets in kind may, with the sanction of a special resolution, be divided among Shareholders in such proportion as the liquidator may determine.

7.8 Constitution

The Constitution can only be amended by a special resolution passed by at least three quarters of Shareholders present and voting at the general meeting.

8. Rights and liabilities of Attaching Options

One (1) Attaching Option will be issued for every two (2) New Shares issued in accordance with this Prospectus for nil additional consideration. The Attaching Options will be issued on the following terms and conditions.

8.1 Exercise Period and Expiry Date

The Attaching Options are exercisable at any time on a Business Day prior to 5:00pm (Sydney time) on 30 November 2028 (**Expiry Date**). Attaching Options not exercised by that date will lapse.

8.2 Exercise Price

Attaching Options must be exercised in respect of a minimum of 100,000 Attaching Options except where an Option holder holds less than 100,000 Attaching Options, in which case all Attaching Options held by that Option holder must be exercised.

8.4 Shares Issued on Exercise of Attaching Options

Shares to be issued pursuant to the exercise of Attaching Options will be issued following receipt of all the relevant documents and payments (in cleared funds) and will rank equally with the then issued Shares.

Shares issued pursuant to the exercise of Attaching Options will have the same rights and liabilities as Altitude Minerals' existing Shares on issue as at the date of the exercise of the Attaching Options. The full details of the rights attaching to Shares are set out in Altitude Minerals Constitution. 8.5 Transfer and Quotation

The holder of any Options may transfer some or all of their Options in any manner authorised by the ASX or the Corporations Act.

Altitude Minerals has not applied, and does not currently intend to apply, to the ASX for Quotation of the Attaching Options, but reserves the right to do so in the future if permitted by the Corporations Act and Listing Rules.

8.6 Participation Rights or Entitlements

There are no participating rights or entitlements inherent in the Attaching Options and holders will not be entitled to participate in new issues of securities offered to Shareholders during the term of the Attaching Options, except in their capacity as existing Shareholders.

8.7 Bonus Issues

If, prior to the expiry of the options, Altitude Minerals makes a bonus issue of Shares to Shareholders for no consideration, the number of Shares over which an Attaching Option is exercisable will be increased by the number of Shares which the holder would have received if the Attaching Option had been exercised before the relevant record date for the bonus issue.

8.8 Pro-Rata Issue

If, from time to time, before the expiry of the Attaching Options, Altitude Minerals makes a pro-rata issue of Shares to shareholders, the exercise price of the Attaching Options may be amended in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 6.22.2.

8.9 Capital reorganisation

If there is a reorganisation of the issued capital of Altitude Minerals (including any consolidation, subdivision, reduction, or return of capital), the rights of the holder of Attaching Options shall be changed to the extent necessary to comply with the ASX Listing Rules at the time of the reorganisation.

8.10 Takeovers prohibition

- (a) The issue of Shares on exercise of the Attaching Options is subject to and conditional upon the issue of the relevant Shares not resulting in any person being in breach of section 606(1) of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) The Company will not be required to seek the approval of its members for the purposes of item 7 of section 611 of the Corporations Act to permit the issue of any Shares on exercise of the Attaching Options.

8.11 No other rights

An Attaching Option does not give a holder any rights other than those expressly provided by these terms and those provided at law where such rights at law cannot be excluded by these terms.

8.12 Amendments required by ASX

The terms of the Attaching Options may be amended as considered necessary or desirable by the Board in order to comply with the Listing Rules, or any directions of ASX regarding the terms provided that, subject to compliance with the Listing Rules, following such amendment, the economic and other rights of the holder are not diminished or terminated.
